write this letter in hopes of commissioning public works as an artist and muralist for the Rosa Parks RTS Downtown Station. My name is Alan Pearsall, principal artist at Alan Pearsall Art & Design. At my studio in West Newbury, MA I produce graphic design, illustrations and large-scale artwork. dio is in it's tenth year of operation. I have

My studio is in it's tenth year of operation. I have successfully completed many public works large in scale and budget. I think having my feet in both the fine art world and the design world keeps my perspectives new and un-faded by conventional cliché. Each informs the other.

I approach every project with the same care and I do not miss deadlines. Private clients and large corporations have commissioned my artwork and I have done public murals for city and state funded organizations. My most recent commission is for a mural for the State of New Hampshire which is under way this May. Its a 285 sq.ft. mural in the lobby of the Department of Revenue.

Murals are a great way to tell a story, celebrate a local hero or create a unique environment. I take the research for my murals very seriously and understand the responsibility to the community involved in creating a public work. My most recent murals depict historical subjects and the possible themes you suggested will make for culturally significant subject matter. My largest mural to date, the *History of Ipswich*, *MA Mural* is a detailed, colorful journey through the past 400 years of the town's history, commissioned by EBSCO Publishing. Painted on an old mill building, the mural is my largest at 2,700 square feet. I felt honored the town trusted me with such a huge, important artwork which is so publicly displayed. Ipswich treats it like a landmark and is being considered as a National Heritage Location. To paint the *History of Ipswich*, *MA Mural* I researched the subject for several months and gained approval from town leaders and the historical society. I pride myself on understanding the subject at hand thoroughly. I recently published a book as a companion to the mural regarding the history of Ipswich, MA called *American Town*, which I authored and illustrated and is available in local book stores as well as Amazon.com.

My aspiration is to continue to do public works. I enjoy working large scale and with historical and cultural significance. Because of a murals large size the painting becomes the environment drawing in the viewer. They are part of it and are affected by it. Simple or sophisticated, a mural transforms a living space. Long before the Pope hired Michelangelo to paint the images of the Bible on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel murals recorded the human story. The WPA murals of the 1930's told the history of America in post offices and buildings around the nation. Diego Rivera used murals to tell of Mexico's past. It is my plan to continue that tradition. Thank you for your consideration.

## CONCEPT/DESIGN

would propose a mural or murals representing historical images referencing Rosa Parks and the segregation movement. I think the imagery should focus on the strength and courage of the individual spirit which Rosa Parks embodied. Also the progress for which we as Americans have come in the time since her one woman protest as a way of inspiring commuter of the difference one person can make. The contribution of Rosa Parks to the fabric of America is a story that must be told and never forgotten. My goal as an artist is to tell these stories to other generations and visitors alike. I take the responsibility of public art very seriously.

### **FABRICATION & INSTALLATION**

My work is done in acrylic and I coat it with graffiti protection. I can paint on panals or directly on bricks or cement. As for budget I generally charge \$40 a square foot which includes all expenses but this negotiable. I can generally paint about 6 square feet a day depending on complexity. This includes sketches and travel and supplies except staging over 12 feet may incur additional cost. I also am comfortable working with local students and community members as a teacher and artist and have done so in the past. I think community involvement is a great way to get the local folks excite about a new project and it injects the experience with of sense of civic pride. I have been teaching art and lecturing for the last 17 years. My background in Graphic Design may be helpful in sinage accompanying the mural or the station in general. The great thing about a mural is you get a lot of bang for your buck and it will last for 20 years or more if properly treated. I am fully licensed and insured.
