

WHEREAS, Caring & Sharing Learning School located in the City of Gainesville in the Alachua County School District has been identified as a Florida Title I Distinguished School for the 2009-2010 school year; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Title I Distinguished Schools Award recognizes schools that have made the greatest progress in sustaining high levels of academic achievement and for closing the achievement gap for students in the No Child Left Behind subgroups; and
