
PROTECTING FLORIDA'S EXTRAORDINARY NATURAL ENVIRONMENT






Paynes Prairie Preserve State Park is truly amazing. The 22,000-acre wilderness, right here in Alachua County, represents the finest of the Real Florida. Distinctive geologic features, rich and productive wildlife habitat, and immeasurable value to the community now and in the future make the Preserve an extraordinary place.

For more than 12,000 years people have depended on the diverse ecosystems of Paynes Prairie. Today, the mosaic of wet prairie, freshwater marsh, open water, and uplands still generate health, livelihood, and enjoyment for the community and for visitors. It is THE place to go to reconnect to nature on more than thirty miles of hiking, biking, and equestrian trails, by camping under the stars, or through a ranger-led activity. The visitor center near the historic town of Micanopy provides exhibits, stunning photography, and an audiovisual program that highlights the area's natural significance and cultural history. A 50-foot-high observation tower at the visitor center offers outstanding panoramic views.

Paynes Prairie staff and volunteers are working hard to restore and protect the Preserve, and to provide opportunites for the appreciation of this unique treasure. Visitors and local residents are encouraged to learn more and become lifelong partners in the preservation of Paynes Prairie.
