Pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, Council review of local government comprehensive plan amendments is limited to adverse effects on regional resources and facilities identified in the strategic regional policy plan and extrajurisdictional impacts that would be inconsistent with the comprehensive plan of any affected local government within the region. A written report containing an evaluation of these impacts, pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, is to be provided to the local government and the state land planning agency within 30 calendar days of receipt of the amendment.

DESCRIPTION OF AMENDMENTS

City item PB-11-135 CPA amends policies in the Recreation Element which delete the City park and facility substitution option for maintaining minimum park and recreation level of service standards for new development. The item also makes other amendments to Recreation Element text, Objectives and Policies (see attached).

City item PB-11-138 CPA deletes a table in the Future Land Use Element of the City Comprehensive Plan which lists land use categories and their corresponding zoning districts. The item also deletes associated Future Land Use Element Objective 4.7 and Policy 4.7.1, and amends associated Policy 4.6.1 to remove references to the deleted table (see attached).

1. ADVERSE EFFECTS TO SIGNIFICANT REGIONAL RESOURCES AND FACILITIES IDENTIFIED IN THE STRATEGIC REGIONAL POLICY PLAN

Significant adverse impacts are not anticipated to occur to Natural Resource of Regional Significance or regional facilities as the amendments do not result in an increase in intensity or density of use.

2. EXTRAJURISDICTIONAL IMPACTS INCONSISTENT WITH THE COMPREHENSIVE PLANS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WITHIN THE REGION

Adverse extrajurisdictional impacts as a result of the amendments are not anticipated since the amendments do not result in an increase in the intensity or density of use.

The State Land Planning Agency has completed its review of the proposed comprehensive plan amendments for the City of Gainesville (Amendment No. 12-3ESR), related to amendments to the Future Land Use and Recreation Elements and an updated Recreation Facilities map to reflect policy changes which were received on March 22, 2012. We have reviewed the proposed amendments pursuant to Sections 163.3184(2) and (3), Florida Statutes (F.S.), and identified no comment related to important state resources and facilities within the Agency's authorized scope of review that will be adversely impacted by the amendments if adopted.

The City is reminded that pursuant to Section 163.3184(3)(b), F.S., other reviewing agencies have the authority to provide comments directly to the City. If other reviewing agencies provide comments, we recommend the City consider appropriate changes to the amendments based on those comments. If unresolved, such comments could form the basis for a challenge to the amendments after adoption.

The City should act by choosing to adopt, adopt with changes, or not adopt the proposed amendments. Also, please note that Section 163.3184(3)(c)1, F.S., provides that if the second public hearing is not held and the amendments adopted within 180 days of your receipt of agency comments, the amendments shall be deemed withdrawn unless extended by agreement with notice to the state land planning agency and any affected party that provided comment on the amendments. For your assistance, we have enclosed the procedures for adoption and transmittal of the comprehensive plan amendments.
