Ordinance No. 0-01-59

An Ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, annexing a portion of the City of Gainesville Reserve Area Pursuant to Chapter 90-496, as amended, by Special Acts, Laws of Florida, known as the Alachua County Boundary Adjustment Act; making certain findings; including within the corporate limits of the City of Gainesville, Florida, that certain compact and contiguous area located on Lot 3, North Florida Regional Doctors Office Park Subdivision, located at 1201 NW 64th Terrace; providing for inclusion of the area in Appendix I of the City Charter; providing for land use and zoning regulations; providing for persons engaged in any occupation, business, trade or profession; providing directions to the City Manager and Clerk of the Commission; providing a severability clause; and providing an immediate effective date.

Recommendation: The City Commission adopt the proposed ordinance.

The adoption of an annexation ordinance is the final stage in the annexation process under the provisions of the Alachua County Boundary Adjustment Act. On Monday, July 23, 2001, at a regular city commission meeting, the City Commission received and accepted the petition for voluntary annexation, and determined that the petition bore the signature of the owner of the property this is the subject of this annexation. On September 10, 2001 and September 24, 2001, the City Commission held advertised public hearings and adopted the Urban Services Report as mandated by the Boundary Adjustment Act.

ANNEXATION ORDINANCE

The annexation ordinance proposes to annex a contiguous, compact, unincorporated portion of the reserve area. The Boundary Adjustment Act requires the ordinance to be adopted as a nonemergency ordinance and to include one reasonably compact area.

In the Ordinance the City Commission makes certain findings of fact related to the area proposed for annexation. The area must meet certain standards as required by the Boundary Adjustment Act. In this regard, your attention is drawn to Section 1 of this Ordinance and the presentation by the City Manager.

The Alachua County land use plan and zoning or subdivision regulations will remain in effect until the area is rezoned by the City adopts a comprehensive plan amendment that includes the annexed area. During the interim period, the City may rezone properties in the annexed area to an Alachua County Zoning classification/category that conforms with the Alachua County Comprehensive Plan in accordance with Chapter 163, F.S.

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WHEREAS, Chapter 90-496, Special Acts, Laws of Florida, as amended by Chapter 91-

and providing an immediate effective date.

382 and Chapter 93-347, Special Acts, Laws of Florida, created the "Alachua County Boundary

Adjustment Act" (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Act") which sets forth procedures for

the annexation of contiguous, compact, unincorporated territory within a municipality's reserve

24 area; and

WHEREAS, on January 13, 1998, the Board of County Commissioners of Alachua County

designated the Reserve Area for the City of Gainesville pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, on July 3, 2001, the owner of the real property described herein submitted a

Petition for Voluntary Annexation requesting the City to incorporate said property into the City of

Gainesville; and

WHEREAS, on July 23, 2001, the City Commission voted to accept said Petition and

determined that the Petition bore the signatures of the owners of the property; and

1	WHEREAS, on September 24, 2001, the City Commission of the City of Gainesville
2	adopted Ordinance No. 001611, which adopted the Urban Services Report setting forth the plans to
3	provide urban services to that portion of the Reserve Area proposed to be annexed in accordance
4	with the procedures provided in the Act; and
5	WHEREAS, a copy of the Urban Services Report was filed with the Alachua County
6	Board of County Commissioners and the real property owner affected by this ordinance; and
7	WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville desires to annex a certain portion of its Reserve Area
8	which is compact and contiguous to the present corporate limits of the City; and
9	WHEREAS, pursuant to law, notice has been given by publication once a week for two
10	consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed
11	Ordinance and of Public Hearings to be held in the City Commission meeting room, First Floor,
12	City Hall, in the City of Gainesville; and
13	WHEREAS, Public Hearings were held pursuant to the published notice described above at
14	which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact,
15	heard.
16	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
17	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
18	Section 1. The City Commission finds that the Area described in Section 2 of this
19	Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as the "Area") is reasonably compact and contiguous to the
20	present corporate limits of the City of Gainesville, and that no part of the Area is within the
21	boundary of another municipality or county. The City Commission finds the Area to be within its

Reserve Area and the annexation does not create an enclave.

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*	Section 2. The following described Area is annexed and incorporated within the corporate
2	limits of the City of Gainesville, Florida:
3 4	See Legal Description attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and made a part hereof as if set forth in full.
5 6	Section 3. The corporate limits of the City of Gainesville, Florida, as set forth in Article 1,
7	Charter Laws of the City of Gainesville, are amended and revised to include the Area described in
8	Section 2 within the corporate limits of the City of Gainesville, Florida.
9	Section 4. The City Manager is authorized and directed to make the necessary change to the
10	legal description of the Municipal Corporate Limits as codified in Appendix 1 of the City Charter
11	of the City of Gainesville, Florida, to comply with this ordinance.
12	Section 5. In accordance with Section 171.062, Florida Statutes, the Alachua County land
13	use plan and zoning or subdivision regulations shall remain in full force and effect in the Area
14	described in Section 2 of this Ordinance until the City adopts a comprehensive plan amendment
15	that includes the annexed area. During the interim period, the City may rezone properties in the
16	annexed area to an Alachua County Zoning classification/category that conforms with the Alachua
17	County Comprehensive Plan.
18	Section 6. (a) Except as provided in subsections (b) and (c) below, all persons who are
19	lawfully engaged in any occupation, business, trade or profession within the area described in
20	Section 2 of this Ordinance as of the date of adoption of this ordinance, shall have the right to
21	continue such occupation, business, trade or profession.
22	(b) Except as provided in subsection (c) below, all persons who are lawfully engaged in any
23	construction trade, occupation or business within the Area described in Section 2 of this Ordinance

as of the date of adoption of this ordinance, and who possess a valid certificate of competency acquired by passing an independent testing agency's exam in the licensing category issued by Alachua County shall have the right to continue the construction trade, occupation, or business within the entire corporate limits of the City of Gainesville, including the Area described in Section 2 of this Ordinance, subject to the terms, conditions and limitations imposed on the certificate by Alachua County, and provided such persons register the certificate with the Building Inspections Department of the City of Gainesville and the Department of Professional Regulation of the State of Florida on or before 4:00 p.m. on October 1, 2002.

(c) All persons lawfully engaged in any occupation, business, trade or profession within the Area described in Section 2 of this Ordinance on or after the date of adoption of this ordinance, shall obtain an occupational license from the City of Gainesville for the term commencing on October 1, 2002, which license shall be issued upon payment of the appropriate fee in accordance with the Gainesville Code of Ordinances in effect on October 1, 2002.

Section 7. If any portion of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such declaration shall not be deemed to affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 8. The Clerk of the Commission is directed to submit a certified copy of this Ordinance to: 1) the Executive Office of the Governor; 2) the Florida Department of State; and 3) the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the Eighth Judicial Circuit in and for Alachua County, Florida.
