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however, only the City Commission has the authority to release a lien imposed by the city. In the case which led to the referral to the Community Development Committee (CDC), a request was made to release a lien on properties owned by a property owner whose ordinance violations resulted in a lien but not the properties where the violations occurred.

Staff has reviewed the referral and has prepared a recommendation for the CDC. The recommendation is to provide guidelines for staff that can be used when a request for a partial release of lien is received. The guidelines will be used to provide the City Commission with a staff recommendation to deny or approve the request for release of lien and the City Commission will retain the authority to approve or deny the request.

The City Commission has received two recent requests to release an administrative lien enforced by the city resulting from abatement actions taken by the city. These liens are in place to recover city funds used to abate a city ordinance violation. Staff has added this issue to the presentation and will request input from the CDC if there is interest from members to discuss the issue.
