Vehicles Speeding in Neighborhoods (B)

This item is a request to review the City's Traffic Calming Program and discuss traffic issues in specific neighborhoods. Public Works, Fire Rescue and Police staff will provide an informational presentation to the Public Safety Committee.

*Explanation:* In June 2004, the City Commission placed a moratorium on speed humps and speed tables. This was due to the impact these devices were having in emergency response times. In neighborhood speeding complaints, the most common request is for speed humps.

The City has an adopted traffic calming policy. This policy determines the eligibility for residential traffic calming. Arterial and collector streets (as identified in the Official Highway Map) are not eligible for traffic calming devices. In general, to be eligible, the following conditions must be met:

Petition from the neighborhood;

• Traffic study shows that the 85th% speed is greater than 5 mile per hour over the posted speed;

• Emergency responders do not object to traffic calming on that particular street;

 $\cdot$  > than 50% of the residents living on the specific street to which the traffic calming is proposed vote in favor of the traffic calming device

installation (> 50% of the returned ballots).

Staff also collected data along N.W. 31st Drive near Westside Park and on N.W. 40th Street in the Monterey Subdivision. That data will be covered in the presentation.

*Fiscal Note:* Funds are not currently available in the Public Works Department budget for traffic calming projects.

**RECOMMENDATION** Staff recommends that the Public Safety Committee: 1) hear a presentation from staff on the status of the traffic calming program; and, 2) discuss the status of the traffic calming program.
