Approval and Authorization to Execute a Lease Agreement (B)

This item is a request to Approve and Authorize the Execution of a Lease Agreement with KJB Investment Corporation, a Florida S Corporation.

Explanation: The City of Gainesville has an Exclusive Right of Lease Agreement with Bosshardt Realty Services, Inc., Eric Ligman for the southern suite at the Downtown Parking Garage, known as 60 Southwest 2nd Street. Mr. Ligman has produced a prospective tenant known as KJB Investment Corporation, a Florida S Corporation. KJB proposes to use the facility for an upscale drinking establishment, doing business as the Whiskey House. The Whiskey House will feature a simplistic menu featuring Whiskey cocktails Bourbon, and Scotch spirits but also a listing of all other available beers and spirits. The décor will mirror the theme consisting of bold wood designs and iron accents to mirror the feel of a distillery full of barrels of whiskey. The proposed lease, after negotiations, is for the market rental rate, three percent annual increases in rental rates, starting on the second year, and an initial term of three years. The provisions of the Lease Agreement also provide for two consecutive three-year lease extensions with annual three percent increases. KJB is asking for the first three months of rent to be waived in exchange for approximately \$100,000 of renovation costs. The total rent over the initial term of the Lease is \$111,175.47 including sales tax and utilities.

Staff believes it would be in the best interest of the City to approve the Lease with KJB Investment Corporation.

- *Fiscal Note:* The total revenue anticipated over the three year term of the lease is \$111,175.47 including sales tax and utilities.

Explanation: On February 20, 2014, the City was served with a Summons and Amended Complaint filed by Janice Debose-Wyrick as Personal Representative of the Estate of Artrell Debose. Ms. Debose-Wyrick alleges that on October 23, 2011, her son was shot and killed by an assailant while in the City's parking garage. She alleges that the City did not exercise reasonable care to protect invitees of the parking garage from reasonable foreseeable criminal harm. Specifically, she claims that the City did not provide reasonable lighting, adequate security guards or law enforcement, and warnings of the risk of criminal attacks in the parking garage. Ms. Debose-Wyrick seeks money damages.

Proposed Three Year Extension of Agreement for Professional Auditing Services for the Annual Financial Statements Audit - General Government Segment (B)

Explanation: Florida Statutes section 218.39 and Gainesville Code of Ordinances section 2-433 require the City Commission to employ an independent certified public accountant, not connected with the government of the City, to audit the accounts maintained and the financial statements prepared by the City for each fiscal year. The current contract with Carr, Riggs and Ingram, LLC for the General Government segment for professional auditing services concludes with the audit of the September 30, 2013 financial statements. Carr, Riggs and Ingram, LLC has indicated that they are agreeable to extend the contract for an additional three years under the existing terms of the contract.

The City Auditor's Office has discussed the proposed contract extension with representatives from General Government and there is consensus that the proposed three year extension would be in the City's best interest given the high level of service and competitive rates provided by the current vendor.

Fiscal Note: The base fee for audit services was approximately \$95,000 for the fiscal year 2013 audit. Fees for the next three years would be adjusted based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) percentage change for the Southern Region, all urban consumers, with a limit of 5% per year, as set forth in the current agreement. Fees for these services will be provided in the proposed General Government budget for each fiscal year.

Issuance of Request for Proposals for an External Investigative Review of Gainesville Regional Utilities (B)

Explanation: On December 5, 2013, the City Commission referred the issue of a special audit of GRU to the Audit, Finance and Legislative Committee (AFLC). On January 29, 2014 the AFLC met and discussed this item. The Committee received extensive public input focused on numerous issues of concern related to past management practices and business decisions primarily related to the multi-year development and

implementation of the Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) between Gainesville Renewable Energy Center (GREC), LLC and the City of Gainesville d/b/a Gainesville Regional Utilities (GRU) dated April 29, 2009 and approved by the City Commission on May 7, 2009. There was also considerable discussion regarding the background and financial impact of the "Equitable Adjustment for Change of Law" agreement dated March 16, 2011.

Committee discussions focused on possible actions that could be taken from a management, legal, financial, policy and control perspective to prevent reoccurrence of the actions involved in implementing the GREC PPA and to positively affect the financial outlook of GRU, especially in the area of energy supply and energy delivery.

Committee members agreed to report to the City Commission on February 6, 2014 a joint recommendation for the City to move forward with an external review focusing primarily on GRU past management practices and business decisions related to the implementation and any amendments to the GREC PPA, and including a forward focus on recommendations having positive financial impacts on GRU energy supply and delivery.

On February 6, 2014, after Commission discussion and additional citizen input, the City Commission authorized the City Auditor to prepare an RFP for an external review to address:

1) Opportunities for financial and operational benefit to GRU related, but not limited to the GREC PPA; and

2) Recommendations of institutional controls that can be implemented that would help avoid the management discrepancies of the past and help strengthen the working relationship between GRU management and the City Commission.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>	The Audit, Finance and Legislative Committee recommends the City Commission authorize the issuance of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for an external investigative review of Gainesville Regional Utilities (GRU) utilizing the proposed methodology and selection factors.

Ordinance No. 120991

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending Chapter 4, Article I, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville related to alcoholic beverages; adding a new Section 4-5.2, Minors Prohibited in Alcoholic Beverage Establishments; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate effective date.

Explanation: The City Commission, at its meeting of October 3, 2013, authorized the preparation and advertisement of this Ordinance. The Ordinance adds a section to the Code of Ordinances which prohibits persons under the age of 18 to be present in an alcoholic beverage establishment when not accompanied by a parent or guardian, with limited employment exceptions as provided by state law.

TEXT CHANGE - TEMPORARY OUTDOOR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE SALES AND SPECIAL EVENT PERMITS FOR THE UNIVERSITY CONTEXT AREA (B)

Ordinance No. 130058, Petition No. PB-13-49 TCH An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending the Land Development Code related to temporary outdoor alcoholic beverage sales and event permits; by deleting portions of Section 30-67(g); providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate effective date.

Explanation: PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES STAFF REPORT The City Attorney's Office was directed to draft an ordinance (now Ordinance No. 130695) regarding alcoholic beverage sales outdoors and at special events. City staff met to discuss the appropriate approach for such an ordinance and given that Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances is devoted to alcoholic beverage issues, staff felt that the regulations and permits for outdoor and special event sales of alcoholic beverages should be moved to Chapter 4. As a result, the City Attorney's Office requested Planning staff initiate a petition to delete redundant code provisions related to special event permits and outdoor alcoholic beverage sales that are currently in the Land Development Code. The Land Development Code will continue to regulate permanent sales of alcoholic beverages on property that is zoned for such uses.

The City Plan Board reviewed the petition and recommended approval by a vote of 7-0.
