Results of Staff efforts to discuss mitigation of Alachua County's challenge to the proposed Minimum Flows and Levels (MFL's) for the Lower Santa Fe and Ichetucknee Rivers (B)

Explanation: At the April 3, 2014 Gainesville City Commission meeting, GRU staff discussed the proposed MFL for the Lower Santa Fe and Ichetucknee Rivers, and the Alachua County Board of County Commissioner's vote to challenge the proposed MFL. GRU is in support of the rule proposed by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP). As a result of those discussions, the City Commission directed GRU staff to do three things: 1) meet with Alachua County staff and others to see if an approach can be developed to avoid opposing each other in the administrative hearing; 2) prepare any documents necessary to intervene in the administrative hearing to support the proposed MFL rule should the City Commission deem it necessary; and 3) schedule a Special City Commission meeting on April 10 at 5:00 PM to hear the results of staff's discussions and determine whether to intervene in the administrative hearing.

Fiscal Note: The cost to legally intervene is estimated to be around \$95,000 or less.

Adequate funding is allocated in the capital budget. The impact of a rule challenge on GRU's rates depends on the outcome and is unknown at this time. However, based on preliminary estimates of costs to comply with the originally proposed rule, the costs could be in the tens of millions of dollars.

RECOMMENDATION

The City Commission hear the results of staff's discussions and determine whether to intervene in

the administrative hearing.
