Convert DROP Program to Florida Retirement Type System (B)

Explanation: On September 17, 2015, the City Commission referred an item concerning the DROP program to the Legislative and Organizational Policy Committee.

The discussion suggested that converting the City's DROP program to something similar to the Florida Retirement System (FRS) DROP Program.

The City has two Defined Benefit Pension Plans; the General Employee's Pension Plan and the Consolidated Police Officers' and Firefighters Pension Plan. In 2011 and 2012 the City negotiated changes to the General Employee's Pension Plan that included elimination of the DROP program for employee's hired after October 1, 2012. The DROP program still exists for the Consolidated Plan.

The FRS program outlines specific restrictions regarding re-employment with any FRS employer (pages 19-20 of the program document). The City's Pension Plans are qualified plans under IRS regulations. Our plans follow IRS guidelines on "intent to terminate employment with the City". It does not specify minimum timeframes similar to FRS.

All changes to City Pension Plans are subject to Collective Bargaining with the appropriate employee groups.

Rules of the City Commission (B)

Explanation: On August 18, 2015, the City Commission referred an item concerning the Rules of the City Commission to the Legislative and Organizational Policy Committee.

The discussion was introduced by the Mayor and was related to discussion brought forward by citizens or other commission members regarding an item where action was taken at a previous meeting. Specifically, the Mayor was concerned about groups of citizens coming forward to discuss an issue and the potential to take action based on only one side of the issue being presented.
