#### 160776. Gainesville Annexation Strategies (B)

This is a request for the General Policy Committee to discuss annexation strategies for the areas most impacted by the termination of the Fire Services Assistance Agreement (FSAA). \*\*ESTIMATED STAFF PRESENTATION 15 MINUTES\*\*

Explanation: The Alachua County Board of County Commissioners recently voted to approve giving the required 365-day notice to cancel the FSAA between the City of Gainesville and Alachua County, with an effective date of June 1, 2018. Upon being briefed on the termination of the FSAA, the City Commission directed staff to look at areas most impacted and develop annexation strategies for those areas.

Using design thinking, spatial analysis, and data analytics, this item takes a strategic look at the neighborhoods that will be most impacted by the termination of the FSAA and offers annexation strategies for the City Commissions' consideration.

Issues related to Accessory Dwelling Units within the City of Gainesville (B)

This is a request for the General Policy Committee to discuss issues related to Accessory dwelling units within the City of Gainesville.\*Estimated presentation time is 15 minutes\*

Explanation: Accessory dwelling units have benefits and challenges but they are vital to the housing supply and provide housing options for individuals, professionals and small starting families. They are well suited to low density single-family neighborhoods which are close to core urban areas and high density activity centers. This report examines the provision of accessory dwelling units within the City of Gainesville and the possibility of expanding the accessory dwelling unit program and making the process much easier while minimizing any negative impacts.

Fiscal Note: Adopting the recommendations will require appropriate short and long term budget allocations to implement proposed programs.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The following recommendations are submitted for consideration by the committee.

- 1. The City should direct staff to begin work on identifying quick administrative and process changes that can be implemented to facilitate the use of accessory dwelling units within the City.
- 2. The City should take action to adopt policies that are recommended in the report with appropriate funding.
- 3. The City should also direct staff to prepare a proposal outlining a process for guiding the review, permitting and construction of accessory dwelling units.

### 170143. Vacation / AirBnb Rentals (B)

Explanation: Short-term vacation rentals have increased in number and profile nationwide. Florida has experienced an uptick as property owners have welcomed the opportunity to generate revenue using their homes or spare rooms as transient rental space and websites such as AirBnb, HomeAway, and FlipKey have provided an online platform for them to easily market their space. While in response to their increased prevalence local governments have attempted to regulate or outright prohibit their existence, the State of Florida has stepped in and passed multiple pieces of legislation to preempt them from doing so. This has forced local governments to either depend on local regulation adopted prior to the State's preemption or seek creative ways to mitigate the either real or perceived impacts of short-term rentals on their

In response to the City Commission's referral to the General Policy Committee, staff will give a presentation on the three main topics that will provide a general overview of the short-term rental issue as well as City of Gainesville specific information. The presentation will include local and state legal issues, existing land-use and zoning regulation, and a glimpse into the local short-term rental inventory and citizen issue request information.
