This item is to provide the Zero Waste Subcommittee of an overview of infrastructure that is available in Alachua County as it relates to

developing a possible food waste ordinance. The presentation will also review typical items that are addressed in such ordinances and an update on City efforts to date.

Staff will present a summary on the details related to an USDA grant received by the City for curbside residential food waste collection.

Subcommittee members will discuss the elements of a food waste ordinance.

Explanation: Food Waste makes up a significant portion of the waste stream. When landfilled, as it is now, food waste creates methane which is a significant contributor climate change. Food Waste diversion can assist in feeding those in need. Composting food waste creates a product with value and replaces less environmentally friendly products. Addressing food waste is a key component of a Zero Waste program.

As the City moves towards Zero Waste which will include composting, the City applied for a grant from the USDA to collect residential food waste at the curb employing a community composter. A main goal of the program is to determine if community composters can provide curbside residents with competitively priced service if there is sufficient density and quantity.

Based on the presentation and concepts that are common to food waste ordinances, staff seeks guidance on what elements to include in a food waste ordinance.

Fiscal Note: The amount of the grant project is expected to cost \$68,000. The Grantor will reimburse up to 75% of the expended amount (up to \$51,000.) Matching funds are identified in the Solid Waste Undesignated Fund Balance.

RECOMMENDATION The Zero Waste Subcommittee to hear and accept the staff presentation and provide direction to staff.
