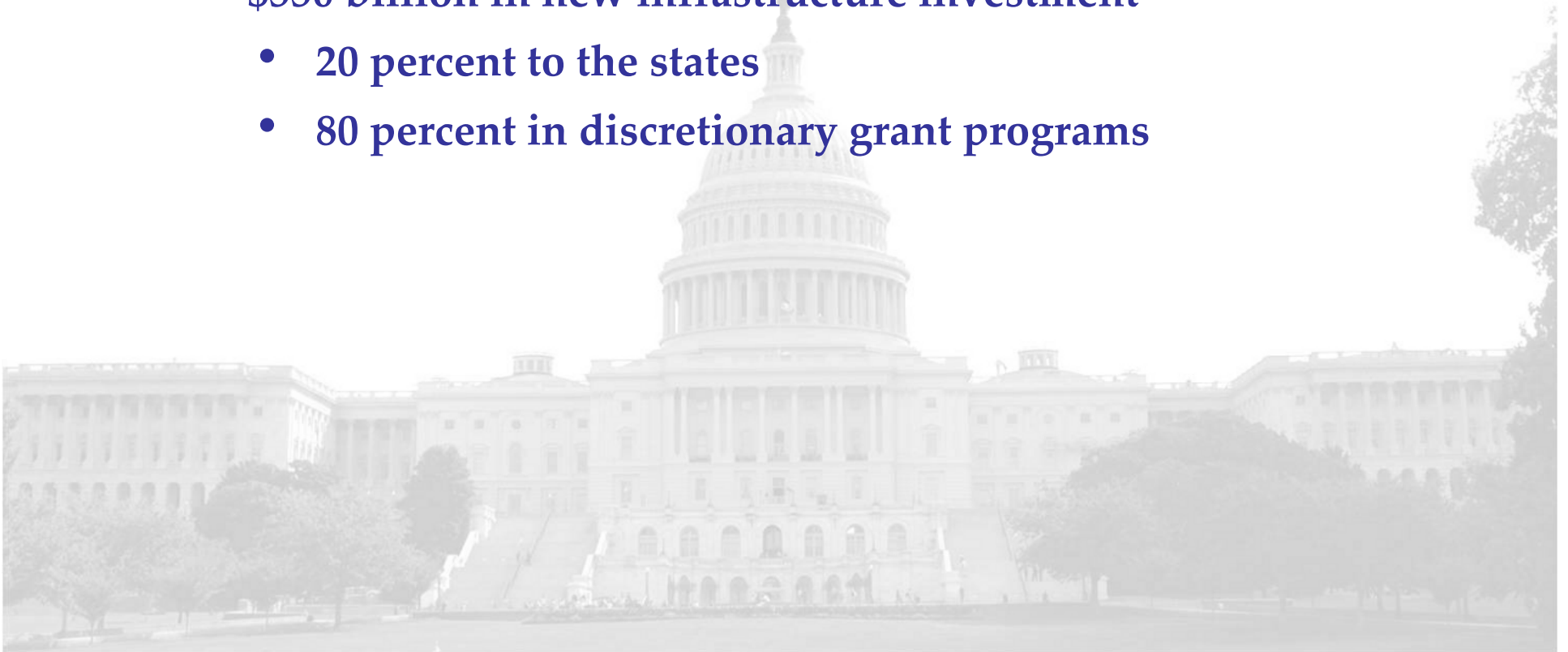
Status of Major Legislation

- **H.R.3684 - Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act**
 - Signed into Law November 15, 2021
- **Build Back Better Act**
- **Fiscal Year 2022 regular appropriations bills**
 - Continuing Funding Resolution through February 18, 2022
 - Additional funding for COVID, natural disasters



Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

- \$1.2 trillion in infrastructure spending over five years
- More than half of the funding continues support for federal highway and transportation programs
- \$550 billion in new infrastructure investment
 - 20 percent to the states
 - 80 percent in discretionary grant programs



Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

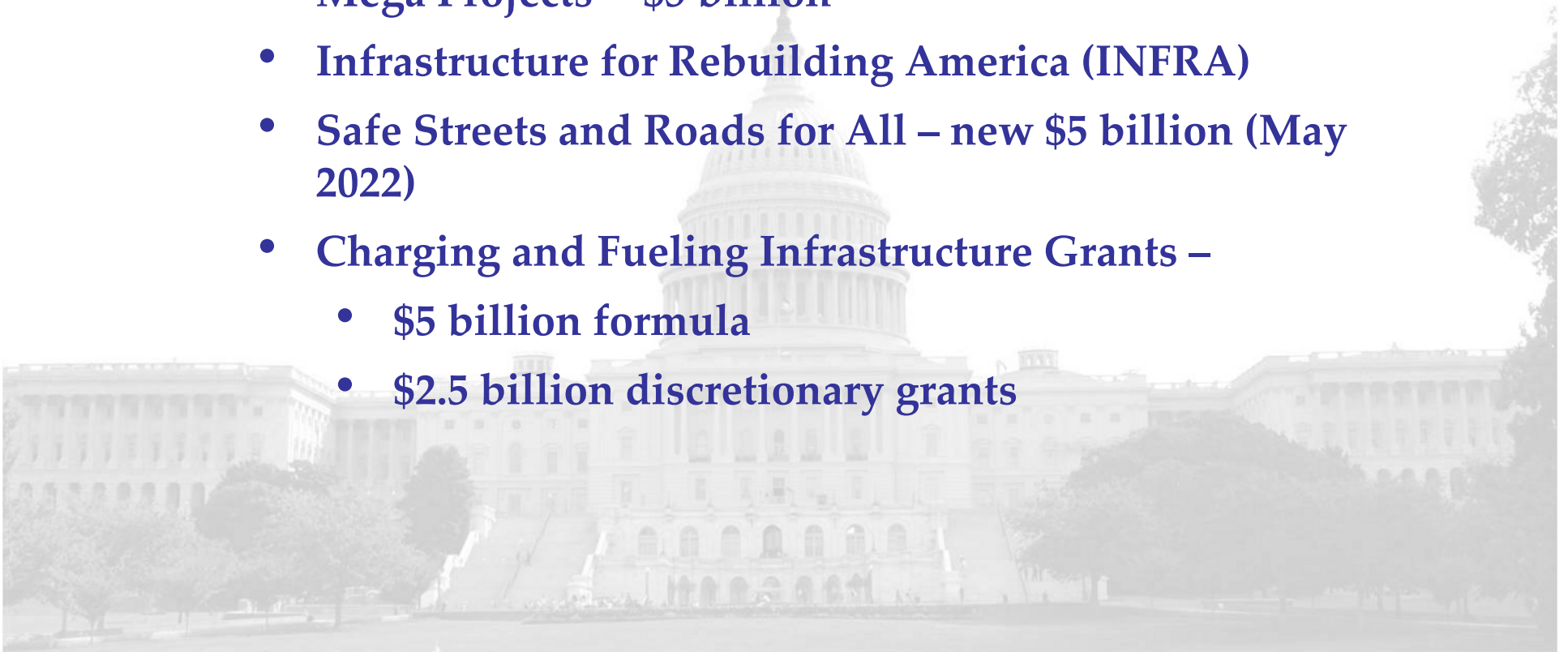
- President Biden named former New Orleans Mayor Mitch Landrieu as Senior Advisor and Infrastructure Coordinator
- Mayor Landrieu is developing cross cutting priorities
- Ramping up federal staffing
 - 98 days to onboard a new federal employee
- Working to expedite construction on projects



Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

The first 25

- Rebuilding American Infrastructure Sustainably and Equitably (RAISE) Grants -- \$7.5 billion
- Bus and Bus Facilities -- \$2 billion
- Mega Projects -- \$5 billion
- Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA)
- Safe Streets and Roads for All – new \$5 billion (May 2022)
- Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Grants –
 - \$5 billion formula
 - \$2.5 billion discretionary grants



Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

The first 25

- Reconnecting Communities -- \$1 billion

Climate, Energy and Environment

- Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities Program (BRIC) -- \$1 billion, September 2022
- Flood Mitigation Assistance -- \$3.5 billion, September 2022
- Brownfields Remediation Program -- \$3.5 billion, Spring
- Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grants -- \$550 million, Fall 2022



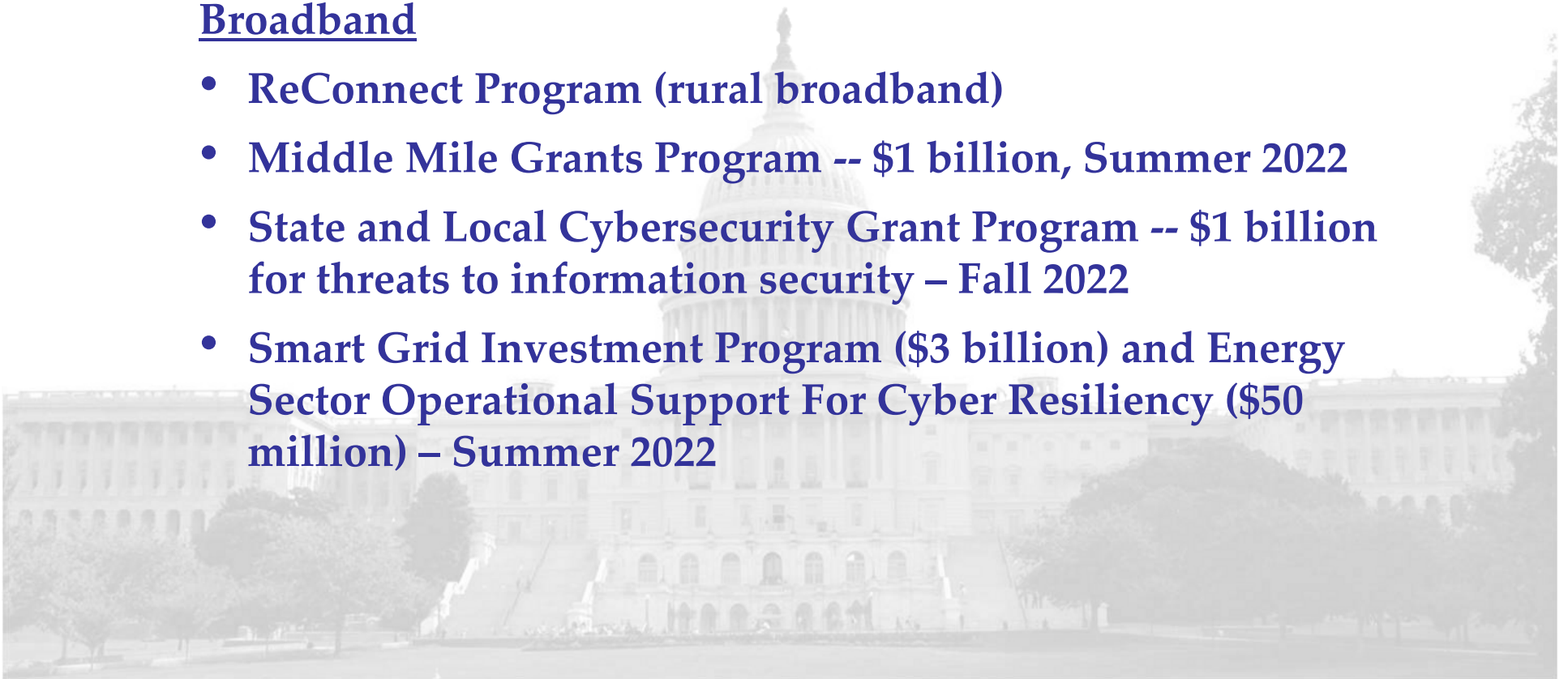
Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

The first 25

- Grants for Energy Efficiency and Resilience Code Adoption – \$225 million, end of 2022

Broadband

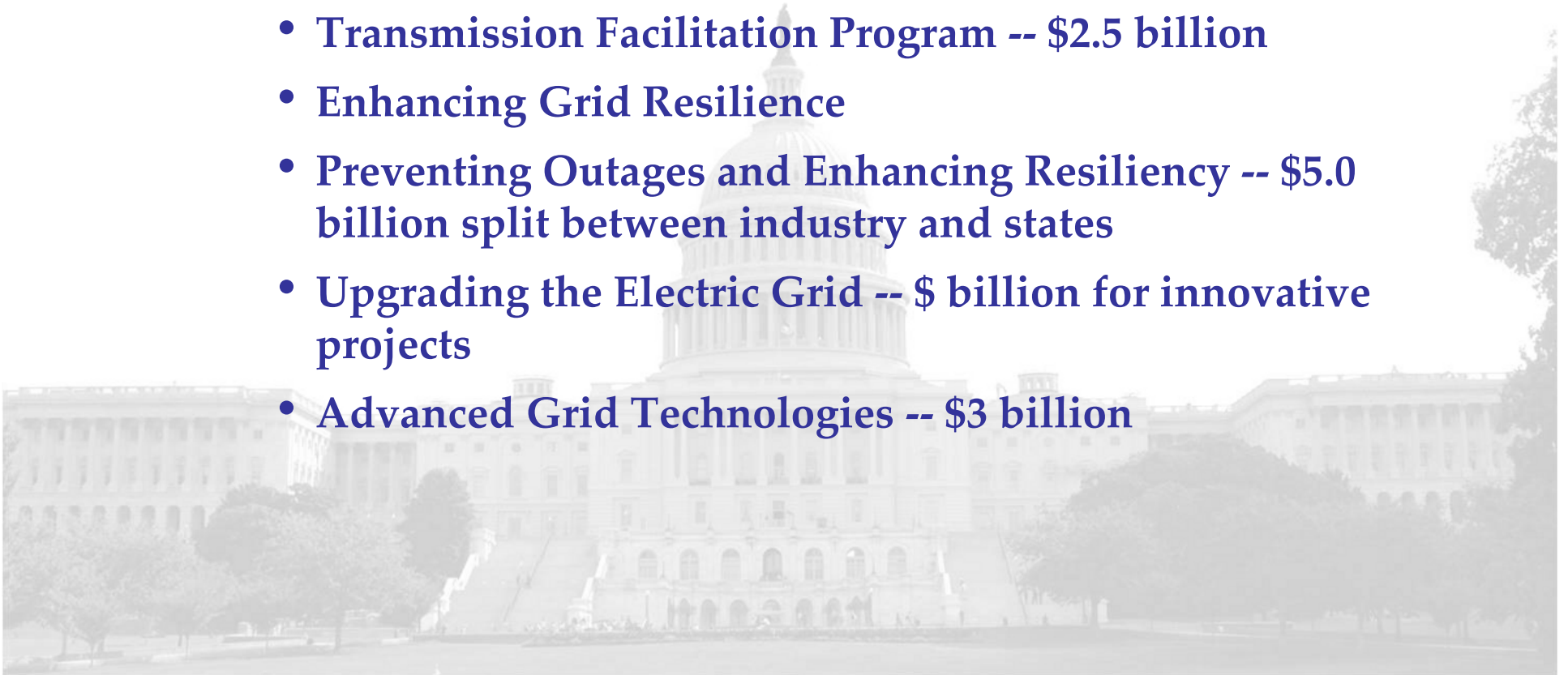
- ReConnect Program (rural broadband)
- Middle Mile Grants Program -- \$1 billion, Summer 2022
- State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program -- \$1 billion for threats to information security – Fall 2022
- Smart Grid Investment Program (\$3 billion) and Energy Sector Operational Support For Cyber Resiliency (\$50 million) – Summer 2022

The first 25

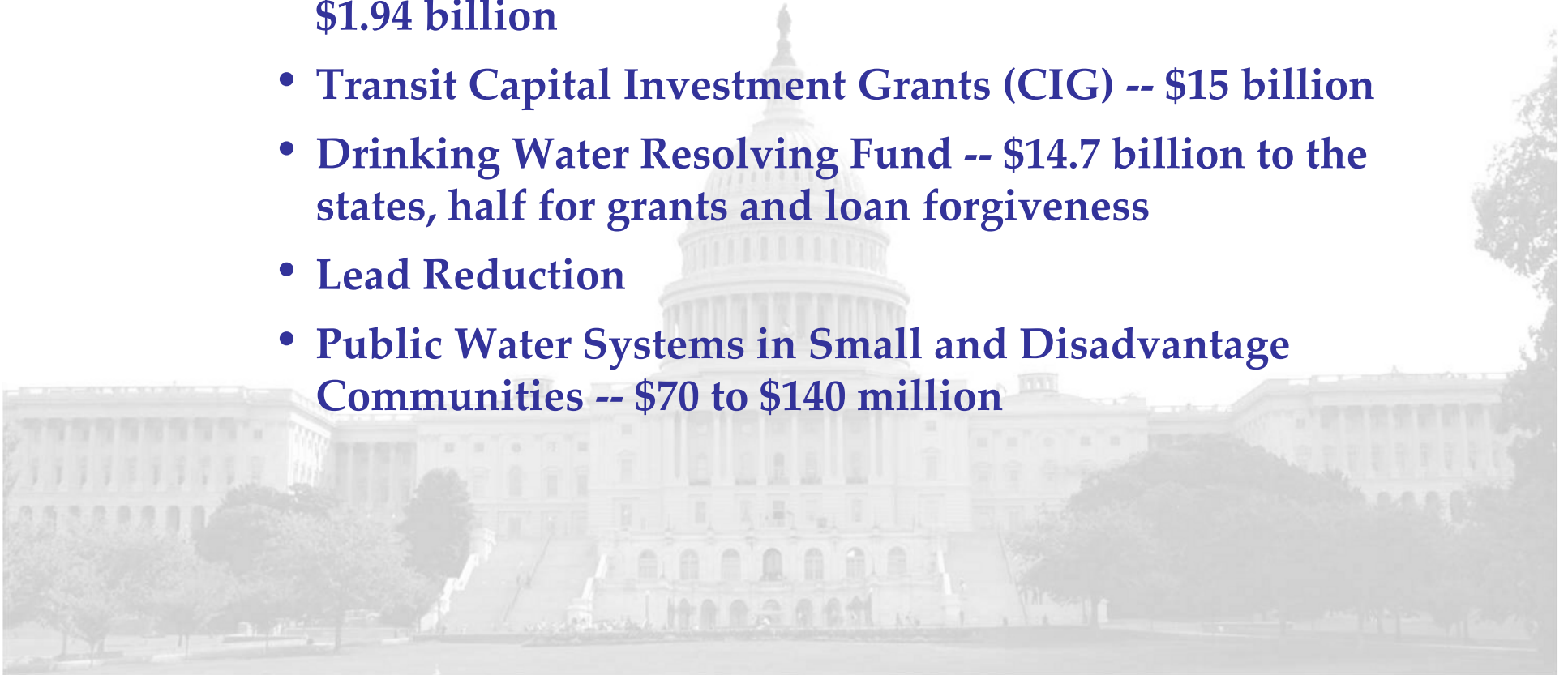
- **Building a Better Grid Initiative**
 - Announced Tuesday
 - Transmission Facilitation Program -- \$2.5 billion
 - Enhancing Grid Resilience
 - Preventing Outages and Enhancing Resiliency -- \$5.0 billion split between industry and states
 - Upgrading the Electric Grid -- \$ billion for innovative projects
 - Advanced Grid Technologies -- \$3 billion



Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

Other Programs to Watch

- Bridge Discretionary Program -- \$3.27 billion
- Lo No Bus Grants -- \$2.34 billion
- Improving transit services for seniors and the disabled -- \$1.94 billion
- Transit Capital Investment Grants (CIG) -- \$15 billion
- Drinking Water Resolving Fund -- \$14.7 billion to the states, half for grants and loan forgiveness
- Lead Reduction
- Public Water Systems in Small and Disadvantage Communities -- \$70 to \$140 million



Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

Other Programs to Watch

- Leak Detection and Repair -- \$50 million per year
- Clean Water State Revolving Fund -- \$14.7 billion
- Sewer Overflows -- \$280 million per year
- Energy Efficiency Revolving Loan Fund -- \$250 million to states
- Residential and Community Recycling Programs -- \$75 million
- Reduce battery waste -- \$15 million



Job Corps Property

- Two ways to dispose of federal property
 - 2016 Federal Assets Sale and Transfer Act (FASTA)
 - General Services Administration (GSA) Public Benefit Conveyance
