2022 Parking Management Changes Update

Purpose:

On August 19, 2021 City Commission adopted parking management changes that went into effect on January 3, 2022 to respond to the #2 mobility priority identified by respondents to the City's 2021 Community Survey to improve the ease to find public parking.

Key Highlights:

- Management changes <u>re-assigned</u> free and paid parking areas **no parking spaces or meters have been removed** from the public inventory
- The same parking options that were available prior to the changes are still in effect:
 - o free or paid parking
 - o coin or credit card for payment
 - o meter, mobile phone, or website to pay for parking
- High demand areas hourly parking rate increased to \$1.00/hour
- Lower demand and longer term parking areas hourly rate decreased to \$0.50/hour
- No requirement was instituted to use an app or a phone to pay to park
- Parking citations are suspended for the month of January to allow an adjustment period for the changes
- Coin meters will be installed on SE 1st Street and SE 1st Avenue to provide more payment options in the core of downtown. Locations noted on attached map.
- Passport Mobile Pay App adoption rate: Launched in 2019 the app accounted for 29% of parking transactions; as of the end of 2021, 66% of parking transactions are via the app
- Companion programs also launched in January:
 - Downtown business discounted employee permits
 - o Long term permits in surface lots for local residents
