History of Demolition in Gainesville


Fifth Avenue

 1982–2012: 91 buildings demolished (23%)*

Pleasant Street

- 1986-2012: 55 buildings demolished
- "'demolition by neglect'... jeopardizes the Pleasant Street Historic District's standing as a historic district"*


- Prevent the demolition of homes
- Preserve the original character-defining architectural elements of neighborhoods

Proposed Offerings

- Exterior work which results in repair, improvement, reconstruction, maintenance or stabilization
 - Examples
 - Exterior wall repairs
 - Roof repairs
 - Foundation repairs
 - Masonry-stucco repairs
 - Porch and step rehabilitation
 - Window repair
 - Cornices and parapet repairs
 - Structural rehabilitation/reinforcement
- City contracts and oversees repairs
- Forgivable mortgage loan if reside for 10 years
- Annual to bi-annual application periods









Eligibility Requirements

Property

- Single & attached dwelling-units
- Residential
- Contributing structure in Pleasant Street Historic District OR registered on the local historic register
 - *Note: Staff will assist homeowner apply to be on register
- Fifth Avenue, Porters Quarters, Pleasant Street, Springhill

Applicant

- Owns and occupies house OR family member occupies house
- Area median income or below

FY 2022 Budget Pilot Year: \$76,868

- Estimated \$2,000 to \$30,000**±** per repair
- Awards competitive & determined per annual/bi-annual application periods
- Next Steps
 - City-wide Request for Qualifications (RFQ) from Contractors
 - Anticipated Start Date: after RFQ is complete

FY 2023 Budget: \$76,868
