RESOLUTIONS

211352. Fire Assessment - Preliminary Rate Resolution (B)

A resolution of the City of Gainesville, Florida, relating to the provision and funding of fire services, facilities and programs in the City of Gainesville; providing for the imposition and computation of fire services special assessments; providing for legislative determinations of special benefit and fair apportionment; describing the method of assessing fire services assessed costs against assessed property located within the City of Gainesville; establishing the estimated assessment rate for fire assessments for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2022; directing the preparation of an assessment roll; providing for hardship assistance; providing for method of collection; authorizing a public hearing and directing the provision of notice thereof; providing for application of assessment proceeds; providing for severability; and providing an immediate effective date.

Karen Fiore, Budget Manager, gave a presentation.

Motion to adopt staff recommendation: 1) establish a Preliminary Rate of \$133.00 per Net Factored Fire Protection Unit (NFFPU) for the Fire Services Special Assessment; 2) set the public hearing on the Annual Rate Resolution at 6:00 pm (or as soon thereafter as may be heard) on September 8, 2022; and 3) adopt the proposed Preliminary Rate Resolution.

Motion to adopt the staff recommendation, including the proposed Preliminary Rate of \$133.00, with the following modifications:

- New sidewalks and sidewalk connections \$200,000
- Painted crosswalks \$10,000
- New Bus Shelters \$100,000
- Bus driver wages (Have City Manager look at wages, bring something back)
- Reduce swimming pool fees Reduce adult fees by \$0.50, everyone else by \$0.25
- Changes to the County streetlight agreement

Vote Part 1 (fire assessment rate) - Motion passed 6-1, Commissioner Hayes-Santos in dissent.

Vote Part 2 (remainder of motion except for the crosswalk funding) - Motion passed 7-0.

Vote Part 3 (\$10,000 funding for painted crosswalks) - Motion passed 6-1. Mayor-Commissioner Pro Tem Saco in dissent.
