| 12<br>13 | WHEREAS, Section 5.01 of the Charter of the City of Gainesville and Section 9-18 of the                                       |
| 14       | Code of Ordinances provide that a charter amendment may be proposed by a petition signed by at                                |
| 15       | least ten percent of the registered voters of the City; and   |
| 16       | WHEREAS, on August 18, 2008, the Supervisor of Elections certified that the charter   |
| 17       | amendment sponsored by "Citizens for Good Public Policy" entitled Petition 5.08, Civil Rights had                             |
| 18       | been signed by more than ten percent of the registered voters of the City; and  |
| 19       | WHEREAS, Section 5.01 of the Charter of the City of Gainesville and Section 9-18 of the                                       |
| 20       | Code of Ordinances provide that upon certification of the requisite number of signatures, the City                            |
| 21       | Commission shall place the petition on the ballot of the next City regular election;  |
| 22       | NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE  |
| 23       | CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:   |
| 24       | Section 1. The City Commission elects to hold a referendum election on the same day as the                                    |
| 25       | next City of Gainesville regular election in 2009 to be held on Tuesday, March 24, 2009, in order to                          |
| 26       | allow the electors of the City to vote on the proposed Charter amendment proposed in the initiative                           |
| 27       | petition of "Citizens for Good Public Policy" entitled "Petition 5.08, Civil Rights"  |
| 28       | The proposed Charter amendment is set forth as follows:   |

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| 1        | 5.08 Civil Rights  |
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| 2        | The City shall not enact, adopt, enforce or administer any ordinance, regulation,  |
| 3        | rule or policy which provides or entitles any person to claim protected status,  |
| 4        | quota preferences or have a claim of discrimination based upon a classification,   |
| 5        | characteristic or orientation not recognized by the Florida Civil Rights Act (Fla.   |
| 6        | Stat. ss. 760.01-760.11 and 509.092). Any ordinance or regulation enacted  |
| 7        | before this amendment or after shall be construed in conformance with the  |
| 8        | Florida Civil Rights Act. Any ordinance that violates this provision shall be  |
| 9        | void.  |
| 10       | Section 2. The ballot title and summary for the referendum shall read:   |
| 11       | CITY OF GAINESVILLE CHARTER AMENDMENT  |
| 12       | Amendment to City Charter Prohibiting the City from Providing Certain Civil Rights   |
| 13       | Protections and Preferences.   |
| 14       | SHALL THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROHIBIT THE CITY FROM  |
| 15       | ENACTING, ADOPTING, ENFORCING OR ADMINISTERING ANY ORDINANCE,  |
| 16       | REGULATION, RULE OR POLICY THAT PROVIDES PROTECTED STATUS,   |
| 17       | PREFERENCES OR CLAIMS OF DISCRIMINATION BASED ON ANY   |
| 18       | CLASSIFICATION, CHARACTERISTIC OR ORIENTATION NOT RECOGNIZED BY  |
| 19       | THE FLORIDA CIVIL RIGHTS ACT (THE ACT RECOGNIZES RACE, COLOR,  |
| 20       | CREED, RELIGION, GENDER, NATIONAL ORIGIN, AGE, HANDICAP AND  |
| 21       | MARITAL STATUS) (FLA. STAT. §§760.01-760.11, 509.092), AND TO VOID ANY EXISTING ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT WITH THIS PROVISION? |
