Petition Summary

 Amend the Land Development Code to allow Pet Day Care for dogs in areas designated for single family use(RSF-1,RSF-2,RSF-3 and RSF-4) by Special Use Permit as a specially regulated use citywide.

Community Development Committee

- Committee heard the issue on March 22 and April 26, 2011
- On April 26, 2011, Committee refers item to the City Commission
- On July 21, 2011, City Commission reviews
 Committee recommendation and approved a motion to direct staff to initiate a petition to the Plan Board



VILLE Key Issues

- Compatibility with single-family neighborhood and the Comprehensive Plan
- Potential impact on the single-family neighborhoods
- Options for allowing the use
- Potential for other similar type requests



LE Conditions

- The property owner must reside at the property and operate the dog daycare, rental or leased residential homes are prohibited;
- Minimum lot size ¼ acre (10890 square feet);
- Minimum distance requirement from another dog daycare facility with a single-family zoning district is 2000 feet, measured from nearest property line to nearest property line;



Conditions

- The number of domesticated pets(dogs only) shall not exceed 8 dogs including the operator's dogs;
- Hours of operation Monday through Friday shall be restricted to 7:00 AM -7:00 PM, Weekend hours shall be limited to 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM, overnight stays shall not be allowed;
- Indoor care areas shall be limited to 20% of gross floor area of the entire principal structure to a maximum of 300 square feet, separate accessory buildings are not allowed;



Conditions

- Outdoor play areas must be designated and must meet setbacks and be fenced to establish at least a 10 foot buffer from the property line.
 Noise suppression for all pets must be used for all outdoor activities located on the home site.
- Kennels, breeding, and animal rescue activities are prohibited.
- Business tax, appropriate insurance and dog roster (with owners' contact information) must be on file at all times.
