If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this 10 ordinance or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or 11 unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this 12 ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or 13 application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

Section 12. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

Section 13. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage on second reading; however, the effective date of this plan amendment, if the amendment is not timely challenged, shall be 31 days after the state land planning agency notifies the City that the plan amendment package is complete in accordance with Section 163.3184, F.S. If timely challenged, this amendment shall become effective on the date the state land planning agency or the Administration Commission enters a final order determining this adopted amendment to be in compliance with Chapter 163, F.S. No development orders, development permits, or land
