#### BACKGROUND:

The Library District's Board of Trustees consists of seven (7) members appointed by the Library District Governing Board. Three (3) of the seven members are City of Gainesville representatives, three (3) are Alachua County representatives, and one (1) is a representative of the League of Cities. The term of City Representative Dorothy Field expired on March 31, 2012. Ms. Field is not eligible for another term as she has served two three year terms.

The Library District advertised the one City of Gainesville vacancy from December 7, 2011-January 13, 2012 and January 25, 2012-February 10, 2012. Two applications were received. The City Commission did not nominate the two applicants submitted on their March 15, 2012 agenda, as they did not reside within the City limits. The vacancy was re-advertised from April 30, 2012-May 25, 2012. Five applications were received from residents within the City limits. The Library District Governing Board is requesting that the City Commission nominate three of the five applicants for consideration of appointment by the Library District Governing Board. In order to make an appointment prior to the July 18, 2012 Board of Trustees meeting, the Library District Governing Board would like to receive the City's nominations by June 22, 2012.

The five applications and a list of the current members of the Board of Trustees are attached.

#### **Recommendation Action:**

The City Commission nominate three applicants for consideration of appointment by the Library District Governing Board.


