1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 0 1 1 1 1 1 1	AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING APPENDIX A, SECTION UTILITIES, SUBSECTION (4), SEWERAGE OF THE GAINESVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY INCREASING WASTEWATER BASE RATES; INCREASING CONNECTION AND INSPECTION CHARGES; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; PROVIDING DIRECTIONS TO THE CODIFIER; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND, PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SCHEDULE PROVIDED HEREIN.
13	WHEREAS, at least ten (10) days notice has been given of the public hearings once by publication
14	in a newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of the public
15	hearings in the City Commission meeting room, first floor, City Hall, City of Gainesville; and
16	WHEREAS, the public hearings were held pursuant to the published notices described above at
17	which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact, heard.
18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
19	GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
20	Section 1. Appendix A, Section Utilities, Subsection (4), Sewerage of the Gainesville Code of
21	Ordinances is hereby amended to read as set forth below. The remaining section, except as provided
22	below, remains unchanged and in full force and effect.

32	d.	Rates for excess strength wastewater (§ 27-169):	
33		1. A customer discharging excess strength wastewater into the city's wastewater sy	stem shall
34		be assessed a laboratory charge based on the cost of collecting and analyzing sar	nples used
35		to determine the strength and characteristics of the waste.	

1		2. Where automatic sampling equipment is required by the city or requested by the customer
2		and such equipment is owned and/or maintained by the city, a monthly sampling charge shall
3		be assessed based on the cost to the city of operation and maintenance of the equipment
4		plus depreciation.
5		3. A customer discharging excess strength waste into the wastewater system shall be assessed
6		normal strength wastewater charges in addition to excess strength charges calculated
7		according to the following formula:
8		$[Y/X - 1] \times [Z] \times [0.5 \times A]$
9		Y = Measured concentration of wastewater constituent.
10		X = Concentration of constituent in normal strength wastewater.
11		Z = Thousands of gallons of excess strength wastewater discharge into
12		the city's wastewater system.
13		A = Normal strength wastewater rate per thousand in c.5(i) above.
14		Note: Excess strength charges shall be applicable only to the following conventional
15		constituents: COD, BOD, total suspended solids, nitrogen and phosphorus. When COD is
16		indicative of the excess wastewater strength, it shall be the preferred measurement
17		parameter. Where the wastewater contains no more than one excess strength constituent,
18		the charge shall be based on the constituent which results in the greatest charge.
19	e.	Rates for septic tank and portable toilet waste (§ 27-169): Septic tank and portable toilet waste
20		shall not be introduced into the city's wastewater system, except when specifically authorized
21		and only at the time, place and manner prescribed by the city. This wastewater shall be metered
22		and excess strength wastewater charges and industrial user charges shall be assessed.
23	f.	Rates for industrial charges (§ 27-169): Any industrial user discharging into the
24		city's wastewater system shall be assessed a permit application fee for each five-year
25		permit of
26	g.	Right to assess other fees (§ 27-173): The city reserves the right to assess consumers
27		other fees as necessary to carry out the requirements contained within article IV of
28		Chapter 27. These fees relate solely to the matters covered by such article, and are
29		separate from all other fees chargeable by the city.
30	h.	Rates for reclaimed water service (§ 27-169):
31		Customer service charge per bill rendered, per month

34	i.	Wastewater flow-based connection charges (§ 27-171):

1. For two (2) inches and smaller water meters. For applicants of wastewater service requiring water meters up to and including two-inch meter size, the wastewater flow-based connection charge shall be based on the size(s) of the water meter(s) installed according to the following:

23	Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville, Florida,		
24	and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered in order to		
25	accomplish such intentions.		
26	Section 3. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of		
27	such conflict hereby repealed.		
28	Section 4. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this ordinance or the		
29	application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such finding shall not		
30	affect the other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or		
31	unconstitutional provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared		
32	severable.		

1	Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption; provided however
2	the rates and charges as provided for herein shall be applicable to all monthly bills which are for the firs
3	time rendered and postmarked after 12:01 A.M., October 1, 2012.
