Assess neighborhoods to determine the need for infrastructure improvements for bicycle and pedestrian use; continue to expand the network by at least 1 mi/year and expand ADA access.





Desired Outcome:

Adequate and safe facilities are provided to accommodate bicycle and pedestrian use, reducing automobile dependency and increasing accessibility and mobility options to all users of the transportation system.



Funding:

- CIP FY13/17: \$100,000/year
- CIP FY13: \$200,000
- TCEA; CDBG; CRA; FDOT
- Partnerships
- Grant applications:
 - SW 27th St sidewalk
 - SW 40th Blvd
 - Archer Braid
 - Outreach campaign





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New Sidewalks:

- SW 35th Place
- SW 43rd Street
- SW 6th Avenue
- SW 10th Street
- SW 9th Street
- NW 23rd Ter/34th Blvd
- NE 10th Avenue
- NE 19th Place
- SW 41st Place
- NW 20th Drive
- SW 38th Terrace
- NW 3rd Avenue







ADA Accessibility:

- PW goal to install a minimum of 30 ramps/year
- Inventory of facilities in progress to target retrofit and installation







Bike Blvd:

- Low volume; low speed
- Priority for bike traffic
- Increase visibility
- Expand the network to users of all levels
- 4 corridors: \$130,000

(including signage, markings, changes to stops, branding and outreach)




Bike/Ped Safety Plan:

- Target reduction in incidence and severity of bike/ped crashes
- Period 2006-2010

742 crashes involving bike/ped

- 541 (68%) bike; 251 (32%) ped
- 15% severe (death or incapacitating)
- 30% along Univ. Ave & W 13th St
- Gainesville ranks 2nd in bike and 7th in ped severe crashes in FL (cities w/ pop.>75K; Y07-Y11)





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Bike Sharing:

Partnership with UF to evaluate feasibility, locations, cost sharing







Outreach efforts:

- Bike facilities map published
- Roundabout safety videos and adds
- Postcards and brochures
- Participation in over 50 events/year
