A Resolution of the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida, expressing interest in State Surplus Properties and authorizing the City Manager to Negotiate the Purchase of said Properties from the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund of the State of Florida; and providing an immediate effective date.

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection ("FDEP") intends to sell Surplus State Land south of the Gainesville Airport and north of Morningside Park in Alachua County, Florida ("State Surplus Properties"); and

WHEREAS, on July 26, 2012, the Mayor received notice from FDEP that the City must respond by formal resolution on or before September 3, 2012, in order to be eligible to participate in the sale of the State Surplus Properties; and

WHEREAS, the State Surplus Properties must first be offered to other State agencies and departments, however if no interest is expressed the Properties will then be offered to the City; and

WHEREAS, the City is interested in the State Surplus Properties because said Purchase may be in the best interest of the City of Gainesville.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida, as follows:

- **Section 1.** The City of Gainesville expresses its interest in the State Surplus Properties.
- **Section 2.** The City Commission authorizes the City Manager to enter into negotiations with the State for the purchase of State Surplus Properties from the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund of the State of Florida, and to execute all necessary documents, subject to final approval by the Gainesville City Commission.
- **Section 3.** A certified copy of this Resolution shall be submitted to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.
