Recommended FY 2013-2014 CDBG & HOME Allocations

On behalf of the Citizens Advisory Committee for Community Development (CACCD), I am pleased to present our FY 2013-14 CDBG & HOME funding recommendations. The Committee bases its recommendations on a thorough review of applications, site visits made by its members, applicants' presentations, and comments from the public. Each project was considered on its own merits, and the Committee did its utmost to maintain the integrity of its application process and meeting the required time-frame given for the submission of each application.

Our recommendations reflect the Committee's concern with making the best use of limited CDBG & HOME funds. As in previous years, the demands for CDBG and HOME funding far exceeded our ability to recommend full funding for many worthy projects that are seeking financial assistance. HUD encourages funding new agencies to expand services in the community, therefore, similar to last Fiscal Year, this year we have recommended funding three (3) new Agencies. As a result, we had to make the hard decision of reducing funding to Agencies that have previously received funding at a certain level.

In addition to considering the impact of each project proposal, the Committee ensured that all recommended projects supported one or more of the following funding priorities established by the City Commission:

Housing

- Homeless assistance

Nutritional Support

- Job training/employment opportunities

Programs that assist disadvantage or at-risk children or elderly persons

Please note that the CACCD's recommendations are limited to the "competitive" funding under CDBG and HOME, which has allowed the CACCD and applicants to focus on amounts that were realistically available for allocation to community nonprofit organizations. We would like to applicate the Agencies for the time and effort involved to submit their applications for funding, including application deadlines for submittal and taking out their time to making presentations before us.

You should have a report that shows all requests for CDBG and/or HOME funds, along with our recommendations under each activity category by agency. Please note that the CACCD's recommendations are based on the following funding levels for FY 2013-14:

CDBG Competitive Amount Available = \$ 214,230 HOME Competitive Amount Available = \$ 112,954
