

RESOLUTION NO. 130333

PASSED October 3, 2013

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA, RECOMMENDING APPROVAL OF AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC. AS A QUALIFIED TARGET INDUSTRY BUSINESS; AGREEING TO BUDGET AND APPROPRIATE UP TO NINE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$9,000) AS LOCAL FINANCIAL SUPPORT IN THE QUALIFIED TARGET INDUSTRY TAX REFUND PROGRAM; PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the business under consideration, Azalea Health Innovations, Inc., is a healthcare management software and services company; and,

WHEREAS, AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC has corporate offices located at 105 W. Central Avenue, Valdosta, GA and proposes an expansion of its business unit to Gainesville, FL; and,

WHEREAS, AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC intends to locate its new site in an Enterprise Zone designated pursuant to Section 290.0065, Florida Statutes, within the City of Gainesville, Alachua County, Florida; and,

WHEREAS, AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC in its new site, will employ 10 employees and is anticipated to begin hiring in Fiscal Year 2013/2014 with an average annual compensation of \$60,000 per year; and,

WHEREAS, Enterprise Florida, Inc. represents that the average private sector annual wage in Alachua County, Florida is \$34,918; and,

WHEREAS, AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC intends to make a capital investment of \$30,000 over two years; and,

WHEREAS, AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC intends to apply for the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund for an Enterprise Zone location, pursuant to Section 288.106(3), Florida Statutes; and,

WHEREAS, the request by AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC has been reviewed by Enterprise Florida's primary economic development partner in Gainesville/Alachua County, the Gainesville/Alachua County Council for Economic Outreach and Gainesville Area Chamber of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, on September 24, 2013, the Alachua County Board of County Commissioners approved funding 50% of the local financial support (\$9,000) towards this project; and,

WHEREAS, the Gainesville City Commission finds that the expenditure of City funds as local financial support for AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC constitutes a valid public purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FL:


1. That the Commission finds, determines, and declares that the recitals in the preamble are true and correct, and hereby incorporates them by reference.
2. That in accordance with Section 288.106(4)(a)(10), Florida Statutes, the City Commission recommends that AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC be approved as a Qualified Target Industry (QTI) Business.
3. That the City of Gainesville has calculated that this project's average annual wage of \$60,000 is more than 150% of Alachua County's average private sector annual wage as determined by Enterprise Florida.
4. That the City agrees to budget and appropriate up to \$9,000 as local financial support over a four year period commencing in Fiscal Year 13/14 and running through Fiscal Year 15/16 to the Florida Economic Development Trust Fund in the event AZALEA HEALTH INNOVATIONS, INC is certified as a QTI Business and locates its business within the City of Gainesville corporate limits and specifically within the City's established Enterprise Zone.
5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.


