### Optional Binding Resource Determination Process 2/20/14 Ordinance #: 120642

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- City Commission approved the Natural & Archaeological Resources Protection Ord. on 8/2/12
- At 1st reading, CC recommended staff initiate a petition for a binding predetermination of resources

### ILLE Background continued

- Staff coordinated with East Gainesville Development Partners representatives while drafting proposal
- Staff-initiated petition proposing an optional binding resource determination process heard and approved by the Plan Board on 12/3/12
- City Commission heard & approved Petition PB-12-113 TCH on 2/7/13

## Issues that were raised as part of the recommendation included:

- The binding pre-application resources determination should be limited to what resources were on the site
- The binding pre-determination should be subject to some type of public hearing process to provide due process to interested parties



### **Binding Resource Determination Process**

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- Add a new section (k) to LDC 30-310
- Process is optional
- Methodology Agreement prior to application for a Binding Resource Determination (ensures both parties know where and when the study will take place)
- Sole purpose of the process is to assist the developer to know if regulated resources are on the property to assist with later site layout and design



 Planning staff will review solely for the presence of resources and not for proposed protection areas or avoidance, minimization, or mitigation of impacts

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 Study must be submitted that meets Level 1 review requirements; reviewed by staff; recommendation to Plan Board



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- Plan Board review will ensure a public participation process
- Written determination valid for up to 2 years from final Plan Board decision; no extensions allowed

**Updates are required as follows:** 

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- 1. At the time of application for development plan approval must update study for listed species and presence of regulated sinkholes
- 2. Updates also required if major changes on the parcel or adjacent parcel (flood, fire, major storm, new development)



 During the interim period between the binding resource determination and development plan application, applicant must use best practices to preserve and protect any natural & archaeological resources on the site.

Ordinance provides for fees for this review
