Dear Mayor Braddy;

At our board meeting today, the County Commission voted to initiate the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act (Chapt. 164, Fla. Stat.) with the City of Gainesville; to file an action in circuit court to recover real property in the possession of the City of Gainesville; and to send this letter to the City of Gainesville Board. The intent of this letter is to explain why the County Commission took these actions, to describe the matter from our perspective, and to begin the process of working out a solution to this matter. We are aware that this may be the first time that the City Board has considered these issues and we are hopeful that an amicable resolution can be reached.

The property in dispute is the location of the former RTS Administration and Operations Center at 100 SE 10th Avenue, Gainesville, Florida. The County held title to the property in the late '70s and early '80s when the County was operating the regional transit system. In the early '80s, the County transferred ownership of the property to the City by deed (recorded at Alachua County Official Records Book 1457, Book 108, dated January 7, 1983) with the express purpose that the property be used in the operation of a regional transit system. The deed also contained a reverter clause, stating that if the City "cease[d] to use the foregoing land and improvements thereon, in the operation of a regional transit system, then and in that event, the title to said property shall immediately revert to Alachua County, Florida." To the best of our knowledge, the City ceased using the former RTS Administration and Operations Center by January of 2015 when it opened the new RTS facility and, in accordance with the 1980s deed, the title immediately returned to the County. A copy of the deed is attached for your review.

So far the conversation about this matter has been on a staff level and our Board has concerns about the messages that County staff is receiving from City staff. High-level City staff has expressed their contention that the empty buildings and overgrown premises are still being used for transit operations. Based on our observations and the attached photos, this property is unoccupied and unsecured and in a state of neglectful disrepair, the type of disrepair which is common when a facility is not in use.

In response to City staff's contentions and on advice of the County Attorney, the County Commission felt it had to take legal action to protect its interest in the property, to secure the property, to mitigate the County's premise liability, and to preserve evidence that may be needed if the lawsuit unfortunately has to go forward.

To that end, the County Attorney has made a legal demand to the City Attorney that the property be surrendered to the County and that all evidence of use of the facility be preserved. These actions are being taken because, legally, this is the only way to preserve our rights. We are hopeful that the City Commission will recognize this purpose and will not view these actions as adversarial.

The County has been very supportive of the City's RTS program and we hope that the City will keep this in mind when considering how it wants to approach this matter. Members of the County Commission and staff attended your ribbon cutting where your new facility was touted as a state-of-the-art replacement to the 40-year-old, sub-standard facility. The old facility is no longer used in the operation of a regional transit system. From a review of the Clerks records, it is abundantly clear that the intent of the City and County was that, when the property was no longer used for transit, it would return to the County. We hope that the City Board will be supportive of effectuating that intent, at which time the County would withdraw its legal challenge.

We look forward to the opportunity to discuss this matter on a board level.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, this land and the improvements thereon is deeded to the City of Gainesville, party of the second part, to be used in the operation of a regional transit system. This conveyance is made subject to and upon the express condition that, should the City of Gaineaville, party of the second part, cease to use the forogoing land and improvements thereon, in the operation of a regional transit system, then and in that event, the title to said property shall immediately revert to Alachua County, Florida, party of the first part, subject to the interest (* of the United States Department of Transportation.
