





Supporting policy and programmatic topics

Affordable Housing:

Supports the William E. Sadowski Act of 1992 that creates a dedicated source of revenue for housing from a portion of documentary stamp taxes on the transfer of real estate.

Cultural Arts and Heritage Programs:

Supports programs that provide an outlet for expression, and open dialog to assistance youth in coping with negative behavior.

Economic and Workforce Development:

Support collaboration and partnerships to create forward-thinking, business-driven job growth policies that enhance the workforce by increasing career and entrepreneurship opportunities.

Support broadband programs and policies that support competitive, fast, affordable, and reliable internet in Gainesville.

Support net neutrality policies

Emergency Communication System:

Supports a mechanism for collection of the E911 fee on prepaid wireless services by retailers at the point of sale and establishes a new category in the E911 Trust Fund for revenues derived from this fee.

Florida Forever/Florida Community Trust

Supports full funding of the Florida Forever Program and the distribution of funds that support water and land conservation needs for the State of Florida.

Utilities

Supports local solutions for community concerns and needs for governance of the City utility.
