- **Over 100 organizations** participated in the Strike out Hunger Week: Food Drive, Farmshare Food Giveaway & Thanksgiving Basket Giveaway Program.
- Nearly 100 volunteers donated an average of 4 hours towards Strike Out Hunger Week.
- > Nearly 2000 Thanksgiving Baskets with turkeys were distributed to families in Alachua County.
- > 900 Families were served through the Alachua County School District Partnership.
- Over 14,000 pounds of turkeys were distributed to needy families.
- Nearly 120,000 pounds of non-perishable food items were collected and distributed.
- Over 20, 000 pounds of perishable food item impacting 440 families were donated by FarmShare and distributed to needy families.
- Nearly 140,000 pounds of non-perishable and perishable food items were collected and distributed through the Strike out Hunger Food Drive, FarmShare Food Giveaway, Alachua County School District, collection of nonperishable food items sponsored by other organizations and delivered directly to food banks, pantries or back pack programs.
