WHEREAS, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) is a motor neuron disease that leads to the progressive death of nerve cells, causing muscles to deteriorate and become non-functioning. This typically results in a gradual paralysis of all motor function, including speech and ability to breathe unassisted; and

WHEREAS, across the US approximately 30,000 people are living with this incurable disorder, also known as Jou Gehrig's disease, and 5,000 new cases occur each year. Currently, with no medical solution available, average lifespan with the disease is between three and five years after the diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, though the disease is rare, it has a profound impact on those suffering with it, and it affects many individuals in Gainesville. The AIS Association, as well as many research institutions such as the University of Florida, are leading the fight to find treatment and eventually a cure against this devastating condition; and

WHEREAS, educating individuals in this community through this proclamation allows people to gain a broader understanding of how they can support medical research and individuals impacted, as well as take part in local and national activism.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jauren Poe, by the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Gainesville, do hereby proclaim May, 2017 as

ALS Awareness Month

in the City of Gainesville and invite all our citizens to join me to become active and aware of this condition.
