## FIRST AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN ALACHUA COUNTY AND THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE REGARDING PROCEEDS OF LOCAL OPTION GAS TAX

## WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Alachua County and the City of Gainesville entered into an interlocal agreement dated May 22, 2007, to provide for the distribution of the proceeds of the local option gas tax among Alachua County and all municipalities within Alachua County; and

WHEREAS, the parties agree to amend the interlocal agreement to restrict the use of proceeds distributed to the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained hereinafter set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the CITY and COUNTY do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Paragraph 3, Use of Gas Tax Revenues, is amended to read:
- 3. USE OF GAS TAX REVENUES. Funds distributed to the County pursuant to this interlocal agreement shall be allocated according to the following formula:

Bicycle pedestrian facilities	10%
Unpaved road alternative surface treatments	15%
Resurfacing/reconstruction projects, in the following order of priority:  NW 16 <sup>th</sup> & 23 <sup>rd</sup> Avenues  SW 63 <sup>rd</sup> Blvd & SW 62 <sup>nd</sup> Avenue  NW County Road 235  NW 43 <sup>rd</sup> Street  NW County Road 231	75%

The County shall fund the resurfacing of NW 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue/NW 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and 43<sup>rd</sup> Street within the city limits within 15 years of the imposition of this tax. Funds distributed to the County shall not be used for the construction of new roads or new travel lanes.

SAVE AND EXCEPT as expressly amended herein, all other terms and provisions of the original Interlocal Agreement between the parties, dated May 22, 2007, shall be and remain in full force and effect.
