	you on the tracking of illicit discharges found, the map locations of these
	discharges is a good way to identify patterns and provide further education
	in these areas.
	The Department reviewed your SOP prior to the audit and everything
	appears to be in good order and is being properly implemented.
	No recommendations or required improvements needed.
Element 4 –	The County appears to be performing multiple inspections of construction

	checked and if any follow up action needed to be done by the contractor.
	However, on the County SOP it appears that private construction projects
	are not receiving the same levels of inspections frequency. All construction
	sites should be inspected and documented properly.
