QUESTION 1 – PREPARATION FOR FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE SESSION

STEP 1 – BEGIN GATHERING INPUT FROM THE CITY COMMISSION AND STAFF REGARDING PRIORITIES

- o Advocate existing 2017 Federal Agenda to the conclusion of the session.
- o Travel to Gainesville, engage in detailed discussions with Commissioners and staff to create a broad outline of an agenda.

STEP 2 – CREATE A DRAFT FEDERAL AGENDA

- o Prioritize Agenda Items
- o Work with staff to prepared descriptive narrative and other talking points
- o Prepare any needed maps or other visual aids

STEP 3 – OBTAIN CITY COMMISSION APPROVAL

- o Preferably at a January commission meeting
- Pursue support from other local civic and community groups (e.g. Chamber of Commerce, School Board, County, University of Florida)

STEP 4 – PRESENT THE CITY'S AGENDA TO CONGRESS AND FEDERAL AGENCIES

- o Preferably by the Mayor, in person, during an early year trip to Washington (USCM)
- o Present agenda not only to delegation, but also to selected agencies

STEP 5 – CONTINUE ADVOCACY EFFORTS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR
