

**RESOLUTION NO. 170215**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA; RELATING TO THE LEVY OF GENERAL MUNICIPAL PURPOSE AD VALOREM TAXES FOR THE 2017-2018 FISCAL YEAR; ESTABLISHING THE PROPOSED MILLAGE RATE; SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE TO THE ALACHUA COUNTY PROPERTY APPRAISER; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, the Alachua County Property Appraiser certified the 2017 taxable values to the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida on June 23, 2017.

**WHEREAS**, Section 200.065, Florida Statutes, requires the City Commission to advise the Property Appraiser of its rolled-back millage rate, its proposed millage rate, and of the time, date, and place at which a public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rate and the proposed tentative budget.

**WHEREAS**, the gross taxable value for operating purposes not exempt from taxation within Alachua County has been certified by the County Property Appraiser to the City of Gainesville as \$6,547,912,693.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE  
CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:**

**Section 1.** The proposed millage rate necessary to fund the proposed tentative general purpose municipal budget for the City of Gainesville's 2017-2018 fiscal year is 4.7474 mills.

**Section 2.** The FY 2017-2018 proposed operating millage rate is 4.7474 mills, which is more than the rolled-back rate of 4.2300 mills by 12.23%.

1           **Section 3.** A public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rate and the  
2 proposed tentative budget for general municipal purposes on Thursday, September 7, 2017, at six  
3 o'clock p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, in the City Hall Auditorium on the  
4 first floor of City Hall, 200 East University Avenue, City of Gainesville, Florida.

5           **Section 4.** The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this  
6 resolution to the Alachua County Property Appraiser for use in preparing the Notice of Proposed  
7 Property Taxes, as required by Section 200.069, Florida Statutes, and to execute, as the  
8 Administering Official, any Department of Revenue forms necessary to complete this  
9 certification.

10          **Section 4.** This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
