## **ORDINANCE NO. 160967**

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An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, updating *Table 14: 5-Year Schedule of Capital Improvements* in the Capital Improvements Element of the Comprehensive Plan; providing directions to the City Manager; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date.

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- WHEREAS, Section 163.3167, Florida Statutes, requires the City of Gainesville to maintain a 9 Comprehensive Plan to guide the future development and growth of the city, and which per 10 Section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, must provide the principles, guidelines, standards, and 11 strategies for the orderly and balanced future economic, social, physical, environmental, and 12 fiscal development of the city as reflected by the community's commitments to implement such 13 plan; and 14 WHEREAS, Section 163.3177, Florida Statutes, requires the City of Gainesville to include as 15 part of its Comprehensive Plan a Capital Improvements Element that considers the need for and 16 the location of public facilities and encourages the efficient use of such facilities; and 17 WHEREAS, Section 163.3177(3)(a), Florida Statutes, requires that the Capital Improvements 18 Element include a 5-Year Capital Improvements Schedule that identifies projects necessary to 19 maintain and achieve the adopted levels of service for the 5-year planning period; and 20 WHEREAS, Section 163.3177(3)(b), Florida Statutes, requires the City of Gainesville to 21 annually review its Capital Improvements Element; and 22 WHEREAS, Section 163.3177(3)(b), Florida Statutes, allows local governments to update their 23 5-Year Capital Improvements Schedule by an ordinance that may not be deemed an amendment 24 to their Comprehensive Plan; and 25
- 26 WHEREAS, notice of an update to the 5-Year Schedule of Capital Improvements in the Capital

- 1 Improvements Element of the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan was given as required by
- 2 law and a public hearing was then held on April 27, 2017, by the City Plan Board, which acts as
- 3 the local planning agency pursuant to Section 163.3174, Florida Statutes, where the City Plan
- 4 Board voted to recommend approval of this update; and
- WHEREAS, at least ten days' notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper of general
- 6 circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of public hearings in the City Hall
- 7 Auditorium located on the first floor of City Hall in the City of Gainesville; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the public hearings were held pursuant to the published notices described above at
- 9 which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact,
- 10 heard.
- 11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY
- 12 **OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:**
- 13 SECTION 1. Table 14: 5-Year Schedule of Capital Improvements contained in the Capital
- 14 Improvements Element of the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan is amended as shown in
- 15 **Exhibit A**, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as if set forth in full.
- SECTION 2. It is the intent of the City Commission that the provisions of Section 1 of this
- ordinance shall become and be made a part of the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan.
- 18 SECTION 3. The City Manager or designee is authorized and directed to make the necessary
- 19 changes to the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan in order to fully implement this
- ordinance. The City Manager or designee is authorized to correct any typographical errors that
- 21 do not affect the intent of this ordinance.
- 22 SECTION 4. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section, or provision of this ordinance or
- 23 the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such

- finding shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this ordinance that can be given 1
- effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application, and to this end the 2
- provisions of this ordinance are declared severable. 3
- SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of such 4
- conflict hereby repealed on the effective date of this ordinance. 5
- **SECTION 6.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption. 6
