# **Description**

Discussion on the City of Gainesville's request for County support of City projects (totaling \$3 million) and their ability to compete for the County's proposed competitive grant process, both funded through the Nov. 8 Wild Spaces Public Places ballot initiative.

#### Recommendation

Utilize the State default formula and direct staff to develop a competitive \$3 million grant process from the County's allocation for municipalities, of which the City of Gainesville would be eligible.

#### **Executive Summary**

If the Nov. 8 renewal of the Wild Spaces Public Places ballot initiative passes, in excess of \$16 million is anticipated to be generated per year for eight years, County-wide. The purpose of the initiative is to acquire and improve environmentally sensitive lands to protect drinking water sources, water quality, and wildlife habitat, and; to create, improve and maintain parks and recreational facilities in all cities and the County, with citizen oversight and independent audit, by the levy of a one-half percent sales tax starting Jan. 1, 2017.

# **Background**

The Board of County Commissioners agreed with the recommendation of their appointed task force to use the State formula, which is population based, unless a separate split is negotiated under an Interlocal Agreement. Alachua County is expected to receive \$9.3 million per year (\$74 million over eight years) and the City of Gainesville is expected to receive \$5.8 million per year (\$46 million over eight years). At the City of Archer and Hawthorne joint meetings, the Board discussed a desire to implement a competitive grant process for municipalities to apply for County bond funding. A DRAFT grant application has been shared with Legal and Contracts for review.

# **Issues**

The City of Gainesville is requesting both a dedicated allocation and the ability to apply for additional County's bond funding through the proposed competitive grant process.

# **Fiscal Recommendation**

Depending on the direction of the Commission, up to \$6 million of the County's Wild Spaces Public Places allocation (\$3 million dedicated to the City of Gainesville for joint projects of mutual interest and an additional \$3 million for competitive grants available to all municipalities.)
