Commissioner Cornell, Commissioner Pinkoson, City Commissioner Carter, City Commissioner Carter, City Commissioner Chase, City Commissioner Budd, County Attorney Lieberman, Theresa Scott, City Commissioner Hayes-Santos, Commissioner Byerly, and EPD Director Chris Bird presented comments.

Commissioner Byerly moved the following:

- 1. That the City and County jointly fund Phase I and II of the environmental assessment.
- 2. To direct County staff to work with the City staff to reach a solution that would allow for parking in the area described and bring it back to each Board separately for approval.
- 3. To direct County staff to attempt to work with the City staff on the issue of compensation of the County's financial interest in the reverter clause.

City Commissioner Warren presented comments.

City Commissioner Warren moved to jointly fund Phase I and II of the environmental assessment and that the County and City staff work to jointly schedule community planning meetings.

- 1. Retain parcel B to incorporate into the Depot Park Boundary and pay the FTA \$15,000.00 for a waiver.
- 2. Retain parcel C for future transit uses and no further action from FTA is needed.
- 3. Retain parcel A2 for overflow parking for Depot Park and storage for maintenance equipment needed for Depot Park this will require FTA concurrence and a payment of \$279,228.00.

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- 4. Discuss the future of parcel A with City staff and direct them to perform due diligence including environmental assessment, review of zoning and permitted uses, and a review of site opportunities and strengths.
- 5. Start to consider relocation of modular building for other uses such as Depot Park, Fire Station, or a GPD substation in the southwest.

The motion was withdrawn.

- 2. Allow for temporary parking as long as the County and City staffs can agree on the liability issues.
- 3. Indefinitely hold of the litigation while the environmental issues are worked out.
- 4. Direct County staff to work with City staff to organize a community planning charrette.

The motion failed for lack of a second.

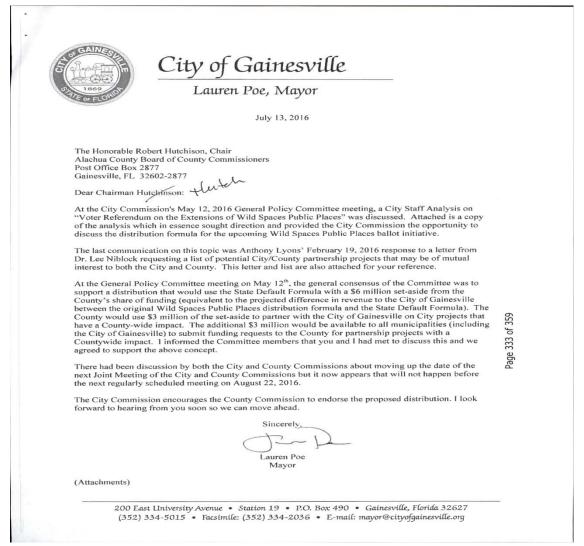
