

Re-cap

- The Alachua County Board of County Commissioners adopted an Irrigation Ordinance in 2015.
- The Ordinance was implemented in the unincorporated area in 2016.
- All municipalities in Alachua County have the option to optin to the Ordinance.
- There are no other municipalities in Alachua County who have chosen to optin.



Recommendation

- gather data on water savings in the unincorporated area since the implementation of the Irrigation Ordinance.







- Four teams then presented their concepts for evaluation, voting, and discussion.








Feedback

 There was not a consensus to opt-in or opt-out of the Alachua County Irrigation Ordinance.

 "We need data!" It was clear that more data and analysis on water irrigation is needed.

 Stakeholders and subject matter experts valued participation early on.





Cost

- Staff estimates the cost of implementing a program established under a City Ordinance would be approximately \$140,000.
- This includes:
 - Education
 - Electronic plan review
 - Stakeholder outreach
 - Inspections
 - Approvals
 - Enforcement
