- Mayors committed to Vision Zero
- Vision zero plan or strategy in place or commitment to develop it
- Key departments are involved (police, transportation, public health)

GAINESVILLE SNAPSHOT (2007/2016)

- Total crashes in City 36,251
- 1,458 crashes involved cyclists/pedestrians (17% severe)
- 10 cyclist fatalities/19 pedestrian fatalities
- 57 fatalities associated with all other vehicular crashes
- 35% of vehicular fatalities involved alcohol
- 50% of bike/ped fatalities occurred at intersections
- 60% of ped crashes and 52% of bike crashes occurred along major roads
- Spike in motorcycle fatalities over the last 3 years
- 81% of fatal crashes associated with aggressive driving

GAINESVILLE SNAPSHOT (2007/2016)

ON-GOING LOCAL EFFORTS

- Implementation of complete streets
- Implementation of new technologies:
 - Leading pedestrian intervals (University Ave)
 - Partnership with Microsoft & Institute of Transportation Engineers to use artificial intelligence to learn about crashes (Gainesville is one of the 16 partner agencies)
 - Automated traffic data collection & visualization
- Enforcement & Education (safety grant proposals by GPD*):
 - Motorcycle safety & education*
 - Aggressive driving & speed reduction campaign*
 - Bike & Ped campaigns (yielding at crosswalks; jaywalking; bike laws)*
 - Seatbelt use*
 - Impaired drivers education campaign*
 - Outreach

ON-GOING LOCAL EFFORTS: COMPLETE STREETS POLICIES

- Local policies in Comprehensive Plan and City's Design & Construction Manual support implementation of complete streets
- Policies are consistent with State & Federal policies
- Complete streets: "... low-cost way to achieve multiple community goals: reducing crashes and injuries, supporting economic development, and encouraging multimodal travel."

ON-GOING LOCAL EFFORTS: PARTNERSHIPS

- Alachua County Traffic Safety Team broad multi-agency composition (law enforcement, transportation, health, fire rescue, school board, MTPO staff) review of safety concerns and recommendations on proposed actions
- University of Florida evaluation of safety concerns, cost sharing, project identification and implementation. Current efforts: lighting enhancements, pedestrian crossing improvements, evaluation of pilot project (i.e. one-way pair implementation at NW 17th St/NW 18th St between WUA and NW 1st Ave), campus master plan
- Florida Department of Transportation funding and implementation of safety related projects
