### **RESOLUTION NO. 171065**

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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE GAINESVILLE, CITY OF FLORIDA, INITIATING CONFLICT RESOLUTION **PROCEDURES** PER SECTION 164.101, FLORIDA STATUTES, THE FLORIDA GOVERNMENTAL CONFLICT RESOLUTION ACT. PERTAINING TO A CONFLICT BETWEEN THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE; ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA; AND THE SHERIFF OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, the purpose of the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act is to promote, protect, and improve the health, safety, and welfare and to enhance intergovernmental coordination efforts by the creation of a governmental conflict resolution procedure that can provide an equitable, expeditious, effective, and inexpensive method for resolution of conflicts between and among local and regional governmental entities, such as the City of Gainesville; Alachua County, Florida; and the Sheriff of Alachua County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, in October 2006 the City of Gainesville, Florida ("City") and Alachua County, Florida ("County") entered into a Fire Services Assistance Agreement (hereinafter "FSAA") effective on October 1, 2006 and remaining in effect until terminated as provided therein; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the FSAA, the City and the County agreed to provide "automatic aid to each other through the response of the closest available unit" without regard to the political jurisdiction in which the event occurred; and

WHEREAS, the FSAA provided for reimbursement payments for fire service costs associated with services provided within the other's political jurisdiction pursuant to a formula set out therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a May 2009 Interlocal Agreement between the City, the County and the Alachua County Sheriff ("Sheriff"), the parties agreed to establish and

33	maintain a Combined Communication Center (the "CCC") providing for coordinated
34	dispatch and radio communication services for law enforcement, fire, emergency,
35	medical, and emergency management; and
36	WHEREAS, the Sheriff is assigned the responsibility for management and
37	operation of the CCC, including the dispatch of both City and County emergency units to
38	all emergency communication calls received by the CCC; and
39	WHEREAS, historically the dispatch of the closest fire unit under the FSAA
40	resulted in the City responding to more calls in the County than the County responded to
41	in the City; and
42	WHEREAS, consequently, under the FSAA, the County reimbursed the City
43	more for fire response costs than the City reimbursed the County; and
44	WHEREAS, in December 2015, the parties agreed to temporarily suspend
45	reimbursement payments under the FSAA from October 1, 2015 through September 30,
46	2017, with the compensatory payments to recommence on October 1, 2017; and
47	WHEREAS, in May 2017, the County provided notice to the City that it intended
48	to terminate the FSAA effective as of June 1, 2018; and
49	WHEREAS, because fire service calls are dispatched by the CCC, the City put
50	the CCC on notice that, as a result of the County's termination of the FSAA,
51	commencing on June 1, 2018, the CCC should dispatch fire service calls by jurisdiction
52	- meaning County Fire Rescue will be dispatched for calls in the County and Gainesville
53	Fire Rescue will be dispatched for calls in the City; and
54	WHEREAS, The Sheriff (and her staff) made a presentation to the City
55	Commission at its meeting on April 5th, at which the Sheriff informed the City
56	Commission that she would continue to direct the CCC to dispatch the quickest
57	response unit (as if the FSAA still existed) after June 1; and

59	WHEREAS, the Sheriff's action will result in the City's fire units being dispatched
60	to fire calls outside the City's jurisdiction without reimbursement of the costs of such
61	service and without the agreement of the City to do so; and
62	WHEREAS, a portion of the City's fire service costs are funded through the
63	imposition of a Fire Services Special Assessment. Per State Law, the City is prohibited
64	from expending Fire Services Special Assessment revenue on property that does not
65	pay the special assessment; and
66	WHEREAS, the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act authorizes the City
67	of Gainesville to initiate the conflict resolution provisions of the Act prior to initiating court
68	proceedings against the County and the Sheriff; and
69	WHEREAS, the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act sets forth the
70	procedures for notice and conflict dispute resolution of intergovernmental disputes.
71	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
72	GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:
73	Section 1: <u>Findings</u> : The City Commission adopts the findings as provided in
74	the foregoing whereas clauses.
75	Section 2: <u>Intention</u> : It is the intention of the City Commission of the City of
76	Gainesville to initiate the conflict resolution procedures of the Florida Governmental
77	Conflict Resolution Act as set forth in Chapter 164, Florida Statutes, prior to initiating
78	court proceedings to compel the Sheriff on June 1, 2018 (the effective date of the
79	County's termination of the FSAA) to dispatch fire service calls based on jurisdictional
80	boundaries regardless of which agency has the closest unit; or in the alternative, to
81	compel the County to reimburse the City for fire services provided by the City in the
82	County's jurisdiction.
83	Section 3: <u>Issues in the Conflict</u> : The issues in the conflict are: 1) the

Sheriff's announced refusal to dispatch fire services based on jurisdictional boundaries;

85	and 2) the County's announced refusal to reimburse the City for City fire services
86	provided in the County.
87	Section 4: The Governmental Entities in Conflict: The governmental entities
88	with which the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida has a conflict are
89	Alachua County, Florida and the Sheriff of Alachua County, Florida.
90	Section 5: <u>Justification for Initiating the Conflict</u> : The conflict resolution
91	procedure is justified because the City of Gainesville in good faith believes that the
92	Sheriff's announced refusal to dispatch fire services on a jurisdictional boundary basis is
93	unlawful, and that the County's announced refusal to reimburse the City for fire services
94	provided within the County is unlawful.
95	Section 6: Conflict Assessment Meeting: The City Manager is hereby
96	authorized and directed to provide a certified copy of this resolution and the letter
97	required by Section 164.1052(1) to the County Manager and the Chief Administrator of
98	the Sheriffs' Office of Alachua County by certified mail, return receipt requested, to
99	schedule a conflict assessment meeting, and to take all other appropriate action
100	pursuant to Section 164.1053.
101	Section 7: This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
