The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") has completed its review of the proposed plan amendment for the City of Gainesville (Amendment No. 18-1ESR), which was received on March 19, 2018. We have reviewed the proposed amendment pursuant to the expedited state review process in Sections 163.3184(2) and (3), Florida Statutes (F.S.), and identified no comment related to important state resources and facilities within the Department's authorized scope of review that will be adversely impacted by the amendment if adopted.

The City is reminded that pursuant to Section 163.3184(3)(b), F.S., other reviewing agencies have the authority to provide comments directly to the City. If other reviewing agencies provide comments, we recommend the City consider appropriate changes to the amendment based on those comments. If unresolved, such comments could form the basis for a challenge to the amendment after adoption.

The City should act by choosing to adopt, adopt with changes, or not adopt the proposed amendment. For your assistance, we have enclosed the procedures for adoption and transmittal of the comprehensive plan amendment. Also, please note that Section 163.3184(3)(c)1., F.S., provides that if the second public hearing is not held within 180 days of your receipt of agency comments, the amendment shall be deemed withdrawn unless extended by agreement with notice to the Department and any affected party that provided comment on the amendment.

Pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, Council review of local government comprehensive plan amendments is limited to adverse effects on regional resources and facilities identified in the strategic regional policy plan and extrajurisdictional impacts that would be inconsistent with the comprehensive plan of any affected local government within the region. A written report containing an evaluation of these impacts, pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, is to be provided to the local government and the state land planning agency within 30 calendar days of receipt of the amendment.

DESCRIPTION OF AMENDMENT

City item PB 17-92-LUC reclassifies approximately 18.5 acres from Planned Use District and Residential Medium-Density to Mixed-Use Low Intensity (see attached).

1. ADVERSE EFFECTS TO SIGNIFICANT REGIONAL RESOURCES AND FACILITIES IDENTIFIED IN THE STRATEGIC REGIONAL POLICY PLAN

The subject property of the amendment is located further than one-half mile from any segment of the Regional Road Network. Therefore, no significant adverse impacts to the Regional Road Network are anticipated as a result of the amendment. Additionally, the subject property is located within a Stream-to-Sink Watershed which is identified and mapped in the regional plan as a Natural Resource of Regional Significance. Nevertheless, significant adverse impacts are not anticipated to occur to the natural resources as, the City Comprehensive Plan contains adequate policy direction consistent with the regional plan to mitigate adverse impacts to the natural resources.



The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has reviewed the proposed Comprehensive Plan amendment submitted by the City of Gainesville according to Chapter 163 of the Florida Statutes.

Amendment Summary

The proposed amendment to the Future Land Use Map (FLUM) re-designates approximately 18.5 acres from Planned Use District (PUD) and Residential Medium-Density (RM) to Mixed-Use Low-Intensity (MUL). Additionally, there is a companion rezoning request to change the Planned Development (PD) and RMF-6 to Mixed-Use Low Intensity (MU-1). The existing and proposed land use designations allow 8-30 units per acre. The property is located at the southwest corner of SW 52nd St. and SW 20th Ave. Access to the site occurs by way of SW 20th Ave. The amendment does not concern property located within an Area of Critical State Concern.
