2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending the Code of Ordinances to prohibit the use of expanded polystyrene containers and single-use carry out plastic bags by creating a new Division 4 within Article III of Chapter 27; by amending Section 2-339 to provide a civil citation penalty; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date.
11 12	WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Gainesville declares that it is in the best
13	interest of the public health, safety and welfare of its residents and visitors to reduce litter and
14	pollutants on the land and in the waters of the City; and
15	WHEREAS, expanded polystyrene is a petroleum-based plastic, most commonly
16	incorrectly referred to by the name of "Styrofoam," which is actually the proprietary trade name
17	of a polystyrene foam product; and
18	WHEREAS, expanded polystyrene containers and single-use carry out plastic bags are
19	detrimental to the environment because they do not fully degrade, they overburden landfills,
20	introduce unsafe chemicals into the environment, become litter and create hazards for land and
21	aquatic animals due to ingestion, and create impediments to waste reduction and recycling goals,
22	while creating unsightly litter; and
23	WHEREAS, use and distribution of expanded polystyrene containers and single-use
24	carry out plastic bags by retailers to consumers for use in carrying purchased goods has a
25	detrimental effect on the public health, safety and welfare of the City, County and State; and
26	WHEREAS, expanded polystyrene and plastic bags constitute a portion of the litter in
27	the City's streets, parks, public places and waterways; and

28	WHEREAS, as an environmental leader among local governments in the State of
29	Florida, the goal of the City is to replace expanded polystyrene and single-use carry out plastic
30	bags with reusable, recyclable, or compostable alternatives whenever possible; and
31	WHEREAS, retail establishments such as ALDI, Trader Joes, and Lucky's have
32	successfully incorporated programs that encourage the use of reusable and/or recyclable
33	alternatives to single use carry-out plastic bags; and
34	WHEREAS, this Ordinance provides for an implementation period (during which this
35	ordinance will not be enforced) allowing retail establishments to expend their current stock of
36	expanded polystyrene containers and single-use carry out plastic bags and transition to reusable,
37	recyclable, or compostable alternatives; and
38	WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that this Ordinance is necessary for the
39	preservation of our environment and the public health, safety and welfare of City residents and
40	visitors and future generations; and
41	WHEREAS, at least 10 days' notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper
42	of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of public hearings to be
43	held in the City Commission Auditorium, City Hall, City of Gainesville; and
44	WHEREAS, the Public Hearings were held pursuant to the published notice described at
45	which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact
46	heard.
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48	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
49	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:

50	Section 1. A new Division 4 within Article III of Chapter 27 is created to read as set
51	forth below. Except as amended herein, the remainder of Chapter 27 remains in full force and
52	effect.

	Sec. 27-89 – Definitions.
60	The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings
61	ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
62	Food service provider means a person or entity that provides food directly to the
63	consumer, regardless of whether such food is provided free of charge or sold, or whether
64	consumption occurs on or off premises, or whether the food is provided from a building,
65	pushcart, stand or vehicle. Food service providers include, but are not limited to, restaurants.
66	cafes, sidewalk cafes, delicatessens, coffee shops, grocery stores, markets, supermarkets, drug
67	stores, pharmacies, bakeries, caterers, gas stations, vending or food trucks or carts and cafeterias.
68	Retail establishment means any person or entity engaged in the retail sale of goods.
69	Retail establishment includes any supermarket, grocery store, convenience store, shop, service
70	station, farmers' market vendor, and any other sales outlet where a customer can directly
71	purchase goods, materials, and products.
72	Expanded polystyrene containers means plates, bowls, cups, containers, lids, trays,
73	coolers, ice chests, food containers and all similar articles that consist of blown polystyrene
74	and expanded and extruded foams that are thermoplastic petrochemical materials utilizing a

- 75 styrene monomer and processed by any number of techniques including but not limited to
- 76 fusion of polymer spheres (expandable bead foam), injection molding, foam molding and
- 77 <u>extrusion-blown molding (extruded foam polystyrene).</u>
- 78 Single-use carry out plastic bag means a bag provided to a customer, typically at the
- 79 point of sale or distribution, for the purpose of transporting items, which is made predominantly
- 80 of plastic derived from petroleum or a biologically-based source.
- 81 Special event permittee means any entity or person, and their subcontractors, agents or
- 82 affiliates, who has been issued a special event permit by the City for a special event on City
- 83 property, in a City facility or in the City's right-of-way, for the promotion or sale of their
- 84 products and/or businesses.
- 85 Sec. 27-90. Prohibition on use of expanded polystyrene and single-use carry out plastic
 86 bags.
- 87 (a) Food service providers and retail establishments shall not sell, use, offer for sale or
- 88 use, or provide food or beverage in expanded polystyrene containers, or provide to any person
- 89 <u>a single-use carry out plastic bag.</u>
- 90 (1) Exceptions: Although the discontinuation of the use of expanded polystyrene
- 91 containers and single-use carry out plastic bags is strongly encouraged, this Division shall not
- 92 apply to:
- 93 a. Expanded polystyrene containers used for prepackaged food that have been filled
- 94 and sealed prior to receipt by the food service provider or retail establishment;
- 95 b. Expanded polystyrene containers used to store raw meat or seafood sold from a
- 96 <u>butcher case or similar refrigerated display or storage case;</u>

97	c. Compostable bags that (i) conform to the current ASTM D6400; (ii) are certified and
98	labeled as meeting the ASTM D6400 standard specification by a recognized verification
99	entity; and (iii) are capable of undergoing biological decomposition in a compost site
100	such that the material breaks down into carbon dioxide, water, inorganic compounds and
101	biomass at a rate consistent with known compostable materials;
102	d. Reusable bags, meaning bags with handles that are specifically designed and
103	manufactured of durable material specifically designed for multiple uses and/or long-
104	term use; or
105	e. Any bags without handles provided to a customer (i) to protect food or merchandise
106	from being damaged or contaminated by other food or merchandise, when items are
107	placed together in a reusable bag, including produce bags; (ii) to hold prescription
108	medications dispensed from a pharmacy or veterinary office; (iii) that is designed to be
109	placed over articles of clothing on a hanger, including dry cleaning bags;
110	(b) Special event permittees, or any vendor operating under that permittee, shall not sell,
111	use, provide food or drink in, or offer the use of, expanded polystyrene containers or single-use
112	carry out plastic bags in city facilities. Upon warning, the special event permittee or any
113	vendor operating under that permittee must stop use of the expanded polystyrene containers or
114	single-use carry out plastic bags, as applicable. If the special event permittee or any vendor
115	operating under that permittee does not do so within a reasonable amount of time, same shall
116	constitute a city code violation and may result in the revocation of the special event permit and
117	fines.
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- 120 Sec. 27-91. Financial hardship waiver
- 121 (a) Any food service provider or retail establishment that reported an annual gross
- 122 income/revenue under \$500,000 per location on its income tax filing for the most recent tax
- 123 year, and that is not a chain store (three or more stores located within the city that conduct
- 124 <u>business under the same business name, or operate under common ownership or management or</u>
- 125 pursuant to a franchise agreement with the same franchisor), may request from the city
- 126 [commission, or staff?] a financial hardship waiver from compliance with the requirements
- 127 of this Division. The city [commission, or staff?] may grant a waiver if the food service
- 128 provider or retail establishment provides reasonable evidence of the following:
- 129 (1) there is no comparable alternative product that would cost the same as or less than the
- 130 expanded polystyrene container or single-use carry out plastic bag, and
- 131 (2) the purchase or use of the more costly alternative product would create an undue
- 132 financial hardship. [How is this determined?]
- 133 (b) If granted, a financial hardship waiver shall be valid for twelve (12) months and may
- 134 be renewed upon submittal of a new request for financial hardship waiver.
- 135 Sec. 27-91. Enforcement; penalties; injunctive relief.
- 136 The city may enforce this article by civil citation in accordance with Division 6 within
- 137 Article V of Chapter 2. In addition, persons who are not in conformity with these requirements
- 138 shall be subject to appropriate civil action in the court of appropriate jurisdiction for injunctive
- 139 <u>relief.</u>

- 141 Section 2. Section 2-339 of the Gainesville Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as set
- 142 forth below. Except as amended herein, the remainder of Section 2-339 remains in full force and
- 143 effect.

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Section 3. It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1
and 2 of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City
of Gainesville, Florida, and that the sections and paragraphs of this Ordinance may be

Section 4. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this ordinance
or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such
finding shall not affect the other provisions or application of the ordinance which can be given
effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or application, and to this end the
provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

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Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of
 such conflict hereby repealed.

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161	Section 6. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption; however,					
162	to allow time for food service providers and retail establishments to expend their current stock of					
163	expanded polystyrene containers and single-use carry out plastic bags and transition to reusable,					
164	recyclable, or compostable alternatives, the City will not commence enforcement of this					
165	ordinance until 8:00 a.m. on May 4, 2019.
