11 12	WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Gainesville declares that it is in the best	
13	interest of the public health, safety and welfare of its residents and visitors to reduce litter and	
14	pollutants on the land and in the waters of the City; and	
15	WHEREAS, expanded polystyrene is a petroleum-based plastic, most commonly	
16	incorrectly referred to by the name of "Styrofoam," which is actually the proprietary trade name	
17	of a polystyrene foam product; and	
18	WHEREAS, expanded polystyrene containers and single-use carry out plastic bags are	
19	detrimental to the environment because they do not fully degrade, they overburden landfills,	
20	introduce unsafe chemicals into the environment, become litter and create hazards for land and	
21	aquatic animals due to ingestion, and create impediments to waste reduction and recycling goals,	
22	while creating unsightly litter; and	
23	WHEREAS, use and distribution of expanded polystyrene containers and single-use	
24	carry out plastic bags by retailers to consumers for use in carrying purchased goods has a	
25	detrimental effect on the public health, safety and welfare of the City, County and State; and	
26	WHEREAS, expanded polystyrene and plastic bags constitute a portion of the litter in	

the City's streets, parks, public places and waterways; and

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28	WHEREAS, as an environmental leader among local governments in the State of	
29	Florida, the goal of the City is to replace expanded polystyrene and single-use carry out plastic	
30	bags with reusable, recyclable, or compostable alternatives whenever possible; and	
31	WHEREAS, retail establishments such as ALDI, Trader Joes, and Lucky's have	
32	successfully incorporated programs that encourage the use of reusable and/or recyclable	
33	alternatives to single use carry-out plastic bags; and	
34	WHEREAS, this Ordinance provides for an implementation period (during which this	
35	ordinance will not be enforced) allowing retail establishments to expend their current stock of	
36	expanded polystyrene containers and single-use carry out plastic bags and transition to reusable,	
37	recyclable, or compostable alternatives; and	
38	WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that this Ordinance is necessary for the	
39	preservation of our environment and the public health, safety and welfare of City residents and	
40	visitors and future generations; and	
41	WHEREAS, at least 10 days' notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper	
42	of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of public hearings to be	
43	held in the City Commission Auditorium, City Hall, City of Gainesville; and	
44	WHEREAS, the Public Hearings were held pursuant to the published notice described at	
45	which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact	
46	heard.	
47	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE

57 58	Sec. 27-89 – Definitions.			
59	The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings			
60	ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:			
61	Food service provider means a person or entity that provides food directly to the			
62	consumer, regardless of whether such food is provided free of charge or sold, or whether			
63	consumption occurs on or off premises, or whether the food is provided from a building,			
64	pushcart, stand or vehicle. Food service providers include, but are not limited to, restaurants,			
65	cafes, sidewalk cafes, delicatessens, coffee shops, grocery stores, markets, supermarkets, drug			
66	stores, pharmacies, bakeries, caterers, gas stations, vending or food trucks or carts and cafeterias.			
67	Retail establishment means any person or entity engaged in the retail sale of goods.			
68	Retail establishment includes any supermarket, grocery store, convenience store, shop, service			
69	station, restaurant, farmers' market vendor, and any other sales outlet where a customer can			
70	directly purchase goods, materials, and products.			
71	Expanded polystyrene containers means plates, bowls, cups, containers, lids, trays,			
72	coolers, ice chests, food containers and all similar articles that consist of blown polystyrene			
73	and expanded and extruded foams that are thermoplastic petrochemical materials utilizing a			
74	styrene monomer and processed by any number of techniques including but not limited to

75	fusion of polymer spheres (expandable bead foam), injection molding, foam molding and	
76	extrusion-blown molding (extruded foam polystyrene).	
77	Single-use carry out plastic bag means a bag provided to a customer, typically at the	
78	point of sale or distribution, for the purpose of transporting items, which is made predominantly	
79	of plastic derived from petroleum or a biologically-based source.	
80	Special event permittee means any entity or person, and their subcontractors, agents or	
81	affiliates, who has been issued a special event permit by the City for a special event on City	
82	property, in a City facility or in the City's right-of-way, for the promotion or sale of their	
83	products and/or business.	
84	Sec. 27-90. Prohibition on use of expanded polystyrene and single-use carry out plastic	
85	bags.	
86	(a) Food service providers and retail establishments shall not sell, use, offer for sale or	
87	use, or provide food or beverage in expanded polystyrene containers, or provide to any person	
88	a single-use carry out plastic bag.	
89	(1) Exceptions: Although the discontinuation of the use of expanded polystyrene	
90	containers and single-use carry out plastic bags is strongly encouraged, this article shall not	
91	apply to:	
92	a. Expanded polystyrene containers used for prepackaged food that have been filled	
93	and sealed prior to receipt by the food service provider or retail establishment;	
94	b. Expanded polystyrene containers used to store raw meat or seafood sold from a	
95	butcher case or similar refrigerated display or storage case;	
96	c. Compostable bags that (i) conform to the current ASTM D6400; (ii) are certified and	
97	labeled as meeting the ASTM D6400 standard specification by a recognized verification	

such that the material breaks down into carbon dioxide, water, inorganic compounds and biomass at a rate consistent with known compostable materials; d. Reusable bags, meaning bags with handles that are specifically designed and manufactured for multiple reuse and made of durable material specifically designed for and provided to consumers with the intention of multiple, long-term use; or e. Any bags without handles provided to a customer (i) to protect food or merchandise from being damaged or contaminated by other food or merchandise, when items are placed together in a reusable bag or recyclable bag, including produce bags; (ii) to hold prescription medications dispensed from a pharmacy or veterinary office; (iii) that is designed to be placed over articles of clothing on a hanger, including dry cleaning bags; (b) Special event permittees, or any vendor operating under that permittee, shall not sell, use, provide food or drink in, or offer the use of, expanded polystyrene containers or single-use carry out plastic bags in city facilities. Upon warning, the special event permittee or any vendor operating under that permittee must stop use of the expanded polystyrene containers or single-use carry out plastic bags, as applicable. If the special event permittee or any vendor operating under that permittee does not do so within a reasonable amount of time, same shall constitute a city code violation and may result in the revocation of the special event permit and fines. Sec. 27-91. - Financial hardship waiver (a) Any food service provider or retail establishment that reported an annual gross income/revenue under \$500,000 per location on its income tax filing for the most recent tax

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year, and that is not a chain store (three or more stores located within the city that conduct

123	manager or designee a financial hardship waiver from compliance with the requirements of			
124	this Division. The city manager or designee may grant a waiver if the food service provider			
125	or retail establishment provides reasonable evidence of the following:			
126	(1) there is no comparable alternative product not composed of expanded polystyrene or a			
127	single-use carry out plastic bag that would cost the same as or less than the expanded			
128	polystyrene container or single-use carry out plastic bag, and			
129	(2) the purchase or use of an alternative product would create an undue financial			
130	<u>hardship.</u>			
131	(b) If granted, a financial hardship waiver shall be valid for twelve (12) months and may			
132	be renewed upon submittal of a new request for financial hardship waiver.			
133	Sec. 27-91 Enforcement; penalties; injunctive relief.			
134	The city may enforce this article by civil citation in accordance with Chapter 2, Division			
135	6. In addition, persons who are not in conformity with these requirements shall be subject to			
136	appropriate civil action in the court of appropriate jurisdiction for injunctive relief.			
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138	Section 2. Section 2-339 of the Gainesville Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as set			
139	forth below. Except as amended herein, the remainder of Section 2-339 remains in full force and			
140	effect.			
141	Sec. 2-339 Applicable codes and ordinances.			
142	The following ordinances are enforceable by the procedures described in this division:

Section 3. It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville, Florida, and that the sections and paragraphs of this Ordinance may be

renumbered or relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.

Section 4. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this ordinance or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the other provisions or application of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

Section 6. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption; however, to allow time for retail establishments to expend their current stock of expanded polystyrene containers and single-use carry out plastic bags and transition to reusable, recyclable, or compostable alternatives, the City will not commence enforcement of this ordinance until 8:00 a.m. on ______8/1/2019.
