


The Life of Districts.




The Revenues.




The Debt Repayment.

- Align priorities by moving CRA to Cornerstone to consolidate addressing community needs around jobs, real estate and enhanced economic development tools
- Engage advisory boards and stakeholders around one district, creating a revised plan and rethinking community engagement strategies
- Revising Five-Year Roadmap: What's done, ongoing and desired
- CRA Staff broadens focus across one district and cumbersome administrative processes are reduced
- Bolstering future City and County General Funds with TIF Recapture
