WHEREAS, straws and stirrers are the 5th most common plastics found in ocean cleanups; and

The Suwannee-St. Johns Group Sierra Club calls for the ban on plastic straws in the 14 counties that we represent.

We ask all Cities and Counties in the 14 counties that we represent to pass a ban on plastic straws. Alachua, Baker, Bradford, SW Clay, Columbia, Dixie, Gilchrist, Hamilton, Lafayette, Levy, Marion, Putnam, Suwannee, and Union Counties
