

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE




- With the passing of Senate Bill 1020 (Ch. 2019-132) on July 1st, 2019, Hemp with a THC content of 0.3% became legal.
 - Hemp resembles and smells like cannabis
 - Testing kits
 - State Attorney's Office Letter (See Addendum)
- Medical Marijuana (low THC) is regulated and able to be ingested, and/or smoked (Senate Bill 182)
 - Must be purchased from a medical marijuana treatment center
 - May not possess more than 70 day supply (forms other than smoking)
 - May not possess more than 35 day supply (Smoking which may not exceed 2.5 ounces)
 - Bill passed on March 18, 2019


GPD PROCEDURE



- Possession of Cannabis is illegal in the State of Florida
 - Florida State Statue 893
 - Investigations leads to other crimes and narcotics violations
- Gainesville Police Department members are mandated to follow our general orders in regards to illegal substances
- Legal Bulletin provided in order to explain the change in enforcement of cannabis possession
- The procedure is as follows:
 - Collect the evidence
 - Complete an incident report/other documentation
 - Test the substance
 - Weigh the substance
 - Submit the evidence to our property/evidence room


DEMOGRAPHICS OF THE INDIVIDUALS CHARGED WITH POSSESSION OF CANNABIS UNDER 20 GRAMS






HEAT MAPS







FACTORS TO CONSIDER IN POSSESSION OF CANNABIS ARRESTS AND DETECTION



- Cannabis is easily detectable to Officers who have lawful contact with individuals during other investigations
 - It can be recognized unlike other narcotics such as cocaine, methamphetamine, and other drugs
 - Arrests for Possession of Cannabis lead to other charges for narcotics that are not easily detectible
 - Areas in and around the Downtown entertainment district also have a high concentration of these offenses
 - Typical behavior of some patrons is to gather in groups in parking areas where fights and other things occur
 - Individuals often smoke cannabis within these groups
 - Several cases stem from traffic stops where an odor is detected after the stop is completed for a traffic violation
 - Looking at the maps and locations of offenses, several occur on roadways
 - The locations where a majority of our UCR Part 1 crimes have occurred are the same locations with the highest concentration of cannabis possession
 - As an agency, when we have crime in an area, we focus our enforcement efforts in those areas
 - With the increase in Police presence, it creates an opportunity to observe an odor of cannabis in our normal patrols
 - Several cases involve areas where open air drug markets exist
 - Violent Crimes are happening in the area
 - Citizens and Community members complain about the narcotics transactions
 - Enforcement efforts are focused on these areas

EFFORTS AT GPD



- Juvenile Arrest Policy changed for all schools in 2015
- Officers are allowed to issue more than one juvenile civil citation in lieu of arrest
- Trainings Initiatives
 - Procedural Justice training implemented yearly by training staff
 - Diversity training offered by the City of Gainesville on a reoccurring basis
 - Disproportionate Minority Contact Training
 - Leadership in Police Organizations (International Association of Chief's of Police)
 - Leadership Academy (Building our Bench)
 - Crisis Intervention Training
 - Mental Health First Aid training

CANNABIS UPDATE



- Possession of Cannabis under 20 grams (misdemeanor) Arrest numbers have decreased from 2016 to present
- Legislative changes have directed enforcement efforts
- Since July 1st, 2019 Hemp legalization (0.3%) has impacted law enforcement policies and guidelines
- Cannabis is illegal
- State Attorney's Diversion programs
 - Program geared towards diverting misdemeanor offenses in order to keep individuals out of the criminal justice system
- Next steps in 2019
