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What is Project YouthBuild?

9-month program:

- Educational
- Occupational
- Leadership

Who is it for?

- Young people ages 16-24
- Who have dropped out of school
- Have a low-income
- Young people with reading and math skills below 8TH grade level

PROJECT YOUTHBUILD

Educational Focus

- 50% of young people's time is spent working towards high school diploma and academic goals
- Hybrid classroom/online instruction along with credit retrieval
- Individualized instruction and support
- Service learning model

Occupational Training

40% of young people's time is spent on occupational training

Renovate and construct affordable housing for individuals, families and veterans living in our community

Young people have the opportunity to earn multiple nationally recognized credentials:

- OSHA-10
- National Center for Construction & Education Research (NCCER) Core Construction
- NCCER Your Role in the Green Environment
- Certified Nursing Assistant
- Other Targeted Occupations
- Matriculation agreement into building trades apprenticeship programs at Santa Fe College

Leadership

- 10% of young people's time is spent on a rigorous leadership development program focusing on 22 competencies
- All young people are enrolled in AmeriCorps and contribute to the local community through impact/service projects
- Young people learn about advocacy, conflict resolution, project management, and other skills necessary to be successful in a variety of settings

Class of 2019 Impact at a Glance

10,225 volunteer hours contributed to local not for profit organizations and governmental entities

Provided 1099 families and 2895 individuals with free fresh healthy food

Renovated 10 units of affordable housing for individuals, families, and veterans living in our community

Worked closely with 15 non-profit and/or governmental organizations to address immediate community needs—immediate response time









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Catching Up

- Most students have been out of school 2-3 years
- Average reading level: 6.5 grade
- Average math level: 5 grade
- 42% of young people have had involvement with Department of Juvenile Justice or Court System

Outcomes

- 69% High School Diploma Attainment, nationally the average is less than 16%
- 664 Industry Recognized Credentials Awarded; over 98% of students enrolled earned transferrable credentials
- Attendance Rate over 80%
- Entered Employment Rate over 75%; 10% enter Post-Secondary
- Employment Retention Rate over 88%
- Recidivism Rate of 6%

\$5,770,893.00 federal dollars brought to local community to serve young people

Scale to Meet Demand

- Significant Waiting List
- Funding to run Project YouthBuild II parallel to existing program while maintaining fidelity to model
- Collaborate with other presenters and community partners to offer additional training in effort to meet local workforce demands
