Subject: Materials for Quarterly GPC Planning Session (Second Quarter FY20)

On August 22, 2019, the General Policy Committee accepted the Clerk's recommendation to pilot a new meeting structure in an effort to enhance efficiency, effectiveness, and transparency. The establishment of quarterly cycles is a key component to this new system and our next administrative meeting to review open items, identify goals, and plan agendas is scheduled for January 9, 2020.

Attached are materials to support your preparation for this conversation. They are:

- A primer of the Policy Process workflow plus the status of each research project and its current phase,
- 2. A listing of pending Referral List items and other standing items requiring agenda time this quarter, and
- 3. A calendar for visualizing the planning.

The goals for the Planning Session are to:

- 1. Review the status of existing policy projects and Referral List items, and
- 2. Schedule items to be heard this quarter.

There are four GPC meetings in the second quarter of FY20, excluding the planning session: 1/23, 2/13, 2/27, and 3/12. The City Manager's Office has requested that the following items be scheduled for March 12th:

- 1. Wild Spaces Update (#180555)
- 2. GPD Quarterly Tactical Briefing (#180985)

Our goal is to schedule three topics per GPC meeting. This allows adequate time for each topic, but also enough room when urgent items arise. There are approximately ten slots remaining for policy and other proposals to be heard this quarter. The Committee is expected to identify those agenda items during the planning session. Ideally, each GPC meeting will also strive to have a focus area as its theme for all items being heard that day. The next quarterly planning session will be held on April 9, 2020.
