2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending portions of Chapter 18 of the City Code of Ordinances relating to Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs, by amending the title of Chapter 18; by amending Section 18-1 regarding the Director of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs; by amending Section 18-18 to update the list and names of parks; by amending Sections 18-20 and 18-21 relating to prohibited activities; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate effective date.
11 12	WHEREAS, at least 10 days' notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper of general
13	circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of public hearings to be held in
14	the City Commission Auditorium, City Hall, City of Gainesville; and
15	WHEREAS, the public hearings were held pursuant to the published notice described at which
16	hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact heard.
17	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE,

The city manager shall have the authority to employ a director of <del>public recreation</del> <u>parks</u> , recreation and <u>cultural affairs</u> who shall be trained and properly qualified for the work and who shall conduct and supervise <u>parks</u> , <u>cultural facilities</u> , public playgrounds, athletic fields, recreation centers and other recreation facilities and activities on any of the properties owned or controlled by the city, or on other properties with the consent of the owners and authorities in control thereof. He/she shall have the power to conduct any form of recreation or cultural activities that will employ the leisure time of the people in a constructive and wholesome manner.

## 7 Sec. 18-20. - Prohibited activities.

8 It shall be unlawful for any person to do any of the following in any park listed in section 18-18 9 of this article or any other areas officially designated by the city commission as a park and posted 10 as such unless specifically permitted by the appropriate authorization received from the city 11 manager or designee and issued pursuant to this article, except for activities of the City of 12 Gainesville which are undertaken within the scope of its governmental authority:

- 15 **Section 6.** Section 18-21 (7) of the City Code of Ordinances is amended as follows. Except as
- amended herein, the remainder of Section 18-21 remains in full force and effect.
- 17 Sec. 18-21. Additional provisions.
- 18 Unless otherwise specified herein and in addition to the restrictions stated in section 18-20, the
- 19 following additional provisions shall be applicable to the parks listed in section 18-18(b):
- 20 (7) Swimming <u>and water access</u> is prohibited at all nature parks, centers and conservation
  21 areas except in areas posted for swimming <u>and water access</u>.

- 23 Section 7. It is the intent of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1 through 6 of
- 24 this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of
- 25 Gainesville, Florida, and that the sections and paragraphs of this Ordinance may be renumbered
- 26 or relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.

1	Section 8. If any word, phrase, clause, par	agraph, section or provision of this ord	inance or the	
2	application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such finding			
3	shall not affect the other provisions or application of the ordinance which can be given effect			
4	without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or application, and to this end the provisions			
5	of this ordinance are declared severable.			
6	Section 9. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of such			
7	conflict hereby repealed.			
8	Section 10. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
