

Food Drive and Food Giveaway Mission: To collaborate with local Businesses, Faith Based Organizations, Education, Government, Law Enforcement agencies, Private, Not-for Profit agencies, City and County Residents, to develop an all-encompassing food drive and food giveaway program to help feed the hungry in our community.

Food Drive and Giveaway Goal: To build a safety net for those in need of food, increase the availability of food to those who are nutritionally challenged, bring awareness of the ever growing issue of hunger, and develop a work plan to unite community food collections, to support our local food pantries.

History



Strike Out Hunger Week: History

- September 16, 2008, Alachua County Initiated the first Strike Out Hunger Food Drive held at Citizens Field in recognition of National Hunger Month and to promote the first Hunger Summit.
- In 2008 26, 000 pounds of food was collected.
- September 18, 2008, the first Hunger Summit sponsored by Alachua County, City of Gainesville, Alachua County Medical Society, Alachua County School Board and United Way to begin the process of developing a Hunger Abatement Plan.

Strike Out Hunger Week: History

- July 2009, Alachua County approved the Hunger Abatement Plan.
- 2009, City of Gainesville adopts the Hunger Abatement Plan.
- Alachua County Nutrition Alliance (ACNA) organized to implement the HAP Plan.
- 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 & 2018, 2019 Community Wide Strike Out Hunger Food Drives were held at The Fairgrounds as a public/private partnership.

Outcomes Report

- Nearly 150 organizations participated in the Strike out Hunger Week: Food Drive, Farmshare Food Giveaway, Food Banks and Pantries Food Giveaway & Thanksgiving Basket Giveaway Program.
- 300 volunteers donated an average of 4 hours towards Strike Out Hunger Week.
- Over 1,300 families averaging five (5) members per household totaling 6,500 individuals received Thanksgiving Baskets with turkeys and other nonperishable food items.

2019 Strike Out Hunger:

Outcomes Report

- Nearly 1000 Families were served through the Alachua County School District Partnership totaling nearly 52,140 pounds of non-perishable food items.
- Over 24,000 pounds of turkeys and hams were distributed to needy families.
- Nearly 30,000 pounds of perishable food items impacting 350 House Holds totaling nearly 1,500 individuals were donated by FarmShare and distributed to needy families.

2019 Strike Out Hunger:

Outcomes Report

 A total of 174,630 pounds of non-perishable and perishable food items were collected and distributed through the Strike Out Hunger Food Drive, FarmShare Food Giveaway, Alachua County School District, collection of nonperishable food items sponsored by other organizations and delivered directly to food banks, pantries or backpack programs.

2008 – 2019 Strike Out Hunger:

Outcomes Report

 Since 2008, nearly 1.2 million pounds of nonperishable and perishable food items have been collected and distributed through the Strike Out Hunger Food Drive and delivered directly to food banks, pantries, backpack programs and families in Gainesville/Alachua County.

- City of Gainesville donate the use of the Thomas Center for planning meetings. We have confirmed the meeting dates with Erica Chapman, Thomas Center. Also, donate use of the King Center for Thanksgiving Baskets Voucher Registration on October 6th & 7th.
- Issue a proclamation at the October 15, 2020 City Commission Meeting in recognition of November 2020 as National Hunger Month.

- Appoint a designee from the City of Gainesville to attend the planning meetings and to keep the City Commission informed of the progress of the Strike Out Hunger Week.
- The Mayor, Manager or his designee attend and participate in the Strike Out Hunger Week Food Drive Drop off on Monday, November 9, 2020 from 8:00 am -5:00pm at the Fairgrounds.
- The Mayor, Manager or his designee participate at the fairgrounds in the pick-up of donated food items by the food banks and pantries on Wednesday, November 11, 2020 from 10:00 am -
- 2:00 pm.

- The Mayor, Manager or his designee participate at the fairgrounds in the FarmShare Food Giveaway Program co-sponsored by Representative Clovis Watson, Jr. on Wednesday, November 11th 12:00 – 3:00 p.m. at the fairgrounds.
- Participate in the pick-up of Thanksgiving Baskets by needy families on Thursday, November 12, 2020 from 12:00 pm – 6:00 pm at the Fairgrounds.
- City of Gainesville and Gainesville Regional Utilities
 Departments and staff to coordinate and
 participate as one of our government organizations
 in the collection of non-perishable food items for
- the food drive.
